

~ Cactusville Facts ~

- 1. The Gold Nugget is the only Bible verse that will be memorized during the week. It is 2 Timothy 1:9, which says, "...(Jesus) who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." Each day the children will practice this verse with the goal of having it memorized by the end of the week.
- 2. Every day, a Cactusville Critter will introduce the Daily Call, which demonstrates a specific way the children are called to follow Jesus.
- 3. There are five reference verses (one for each day) that leaders can use to coordinate with the Daily Call and each day's Bible story character.
- 4. During the closing programs of the Round Up, children will be encouraged to bring money the next day to contribute towards the Operation Wheels mission project.
- 5. A few other terms you should know:

a. Li'l Cowpokes

These are the **pre-school children**, **ages 3–5**. You can choose to have the Li'l Cowpokes join the older children (Buckaroos) for the Round Up opening and closing sessions each day. If so, after the opening they will go to another area and receive special preschool programming with age-appropriate station activities created to maintain the interest and participation of this age group. They will be assigned to groups directed by crew leaders (Ranch Hand Wranglers) who will be with them for the entire week.

b. Buckaroos

These are the children **5–12**. They will be assigned to groups directed by crew leaders (Wranglers) who will be with them for the entire week.

c. Cactusville Ranch

This is the area in Cactusville specifically designed for the Li'l Cowpokes.





d. Wranglers

This is the name given to the **Buckaroos' crew leaders**, crew leaders, each of whom is in charge of 6-8 children. Wranglers' daily responsibilities include taking their groups from station to station and leading out in small group discussions during station activities.

e. Ranch Hand Wranglers

This is the name for the **Li'l Cowpokes' crew leaders**, each of whom may have as many as 8-10 children in their groups. Two Ranch Hand Wranglers are always assigned to each group. Their daily responsibilities include helping the children rotate from station to station and assisting as needed with all activities.

f. Red Band'danas

These are the members of the **Cactusville Praise Team**. This fun-loving group uses joyful music to make the Daily Call (theme) come to life during the Round Up opening and closing sessions.

q. Cactusville Critters

These are **kid-friendly animals** with unique characteristics that are introduced each day during the opening session to provide a visual link to the Daily Call.

h. Daily Call

This is the name for **each day's special message** that describes how the children are called to follow Jesus. The Daily Call is introduced by a Cactusville Critter and reinforced by a call and response sequence led by the Red Band'danas and Leaders from the other stations. Whenever a Leader says, "We are called," the kids respond by repeating the Daily Call (e.g. "Called to forgive! Yee-haw!").

i. Gold Nugget

This is the Cactusville term for **the memory verse**. At the Ranch, the children will practice saying a smaller portion of this verse and repeat it each day, so by the end of the week they will have it memorized. Make sure to use the hand motions that go along with this verse each time you review it. (See AdventistVBX.org.)

i. Reference Verse

This is a **Bible verse that helps reinforce the Daily Call and that day's Bible story**. Children are not required to memorize these verses (there is one for each day), but Station Leaders may wish to incorporate them in their daily lesson plans.

k. Operation Wheels

This is the **North American VBX mission project for this year**. During the week, the Li'l Cowpokes will learn that Jesus loves all the children in the world. Outstanding videos that introduce them to children from many parts of the world will help emphasize this point. Each day the children will be encouraged to bring their money so that they can help other children. The money will be used to purchase a bus that will provide refugee families in Arizona with transportation to school, adult English classes, work, church, and shopping destinations.





Station Descriptions

Overview

In the past, our preschoolers have experienced the daily opening and closing VBX programs with the big kids. In response to the evaluation and comments received from our preschool team, we have simplified our preschool program and made it more age-appropriate. We have also created a richer, fuller VBX preschool program that includes its own opening and closing programs, Bible story station, craft station, snack station, and a game station with a brand new sensory component. This format allows preschoolers to stay in their own preschool-friendly play space from start to finish, and the new sensory activities at the game station provide time and opportunity for unstructured free play within a safe and nurturing environment.

Round Up

Here the Li'l Cowpokes gather together to sing lively songs, practice the Gold Nugget, and meet the daily Cactusville Critter. The children start and end their time at Cactusville Ranch with Round Up, where they first explore and later review the lesson for the day.

Campfire Stories at Sunset Canyon

At this station, the daily Bible story character comes to life. The Li'l Cowpokes use their senses to explore the Bible story more fully through fun, hands-on activities. They also learn new ways to connect personally with Jesus through prayer.

% Trading Post

This is the station where children make fun crafts that help remind them of the Daily Call and that day's Bible story.

Wild Horse Corral

This multisensory station gives the children new ways to experience the lesson for the day through unstructured play as well as the chance to participate in a teacher-led group activity that reinforces the Daily Call.

Chuckwagon

Kids enjoy tasty treats at the Chuckwagon station every day. Here the day's lesson is illustrated through a tasty snack. At Cactusville Ranch one snack option will be available per day.

OPENING Kids sing, learn the second section of the Gold Nugget, and are introduced to Prairie Dog Pete and the Daily Call to be Faithful.



OPENING Kids sing, learn the third section of the Gold Nugget, and are introduced to Chuck the Chuckwalla and the Daily Call to Forgive.

LOSING Kids sing; discuss questions about the Daily Call; learn about June Lily, a refugee from Malaysia; and are reminded to bring money for the Operation Wheels mission project.

Kids follow the story of JOSEPH

as he models forgiveness. They see how Joseph was able to forgive his brothers in spite of how badly they treated him.

GOLD NUGGET / (Jesus) ...who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and grace, which was given to us in Christ Jesus before time **began.** – II TIMOTHY 1:9 (NKJV)

REFERENCE VERSE / Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others. — I PETER 4:10 (NIV)

OPENING Kids sing, repeat the entire Gold Nugget, meet Pack Mule Patty, and are introduced to the Daily Call to Serve.

NG Kids sing, have small group discussions about the Daily Call, meet Juliette from Malawi and Ben and his sister from Republic of Congo, and are reminded to bring money for the Operation Wheels

DEBORAH

and how God helped make her brave enough to serve Him in battle. Kids learn to use their talents to serve God.

GOLD NUGGET / (Jesus) ... who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and grace, which was given to us in Christ Jesus before time **began.** – II TIMOTHY 1:9 (NKJV)

REFERENCE VERSE / Walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us. - EPHESIANS 5:2 (NIV)

OPENING Kids sing, repeat the entire Gold Nugget, meet Road Runner Roy, and are introduced to the Daily Call to Give.

CLOSING Kids sing, have small group discussions about the Daily Call, meet a refugee family from Syria, and learn the total amount of money raised for the Operation Wheels mission project.

MUSIC "We Are Called" (theme song)

Kids hear the story of **JESUS**

What to Expect at Cactusville Ranch





- 1. Work with the Cactusville Director to choose a large room for Cactusville Ranch. This needs to be a place where you can set up all your decorations and stations and be assured that no one will touch or dismantle anything during the course of the week. Inside this room, you will need to designate areas for each station. Refer to page? for ideas for room set up. Keep in mind that you will want Cactusville Ranch to be close to the bathrooms if possible and having a sink in the room would be very helpful.
- 2. Work with the Cactusville Director to choose a large room for Cactusville Ranch. This needs to be a place where you can set up all your decorations and stations and be assured that no one will touch or dismantle anything during the course of the week. Inside this room, you will need to designate areas for each station. Refer to page ? for ideas for room set up. Keep in mind that you will want Cactusville Ranch to be close to the bathrooms if possible and having a sink in the room would be very helpful..
- 3. If you decide to have your own Round Up opening and closing, set up one dual-purpose area that can serve both as a station and the place for the Round Up opening and closing.

Point to Ponder

If your church children's division already has a supply of things for a farm program, you may choose to create your ranch scene from those items. The Cactusville Pinterest board is also a great place to gather ideas.



Decorations & Set Up

So much is in store for the Li'l Cowpokes at the Cactusville Ranch! The decorations for your preschool area will lasso them right into your program with its bright colors, familiar farm animals, and simple yet fun design.

A great barn backdrop can be found at BackdropFantastics.com in their Western theme section. This backdrop includes all the necessary details to set the stage for your farm: a big red barn, a silo, a tractor, hay bales, and a windmill. Add to this a few extra details that will bring the Ranch to life for your preschoolers. A few examples include:

- Large stuffed standing animals such as a horse, cow, and a sheep
- A stuffed chicken roosting on a straw bed with eggs (raffia works well for creating a straw bed)
- Wooden planter filled with hay or raffia to look like a feeding trough
- · Large burlap sacks filled with paper or other soft stuffing
- · A small milking stool and tin bucket beside the cow
- · Metal milk can
- · A stuffed cat
- · Large hay bales
- · Large tin bucket
- · Pitchfork in a hay bale

Cactusville TIP

Decorating your Cactusville Ranch can be easy! Wagon wheels, barrels, old saddles, life-size barn animals, lizards, and small stuffed cats and dogs make great additions. Just let your imagine run wild! Remember to keep all decorations kid-friendly and safe. If you do not want your kids to climb on it, then don't have it in your room!





Staffing Needs & Job Descriptions



Cactusville



You will need a Preschool Director who can also function as the Leader. An Assistant Leader is also very helpful, but is not absolutely necessary to the success of your program. You will need a Station Leader for each of your four stations (Campfire Stories at Sunset Canyon, Wild Horse Corral, Trading Post, and Chuckwagon), and volunteers to serve as Ranch Hand Wranglers (similar to the Wranglers in Cactusville). These volunteers can be young teens, senior citizens, or any age in between. The main prerequisite is that they love working with young children.



Preschool Director/Leader — This individual will work closely with the Cactusville Director when it comes to schedules (when to hold VBX, timeline for recruitment, training, setup, and tear down, etc.), promotional details, registration, and other pre-event organizational particulars. The Preschool Director will also partner with the Cactusville Director to compile If you choose to have a Round Up opening and closing at the Ranch, several of your Station Leaders can team up to lead out in the Round Up. That way you will not need to have a separate opening and closing station leader—a decision that will greatly simplify the recruiting process!

materials and supplies lists for both areas, so that the major shopping or borrowing only needs to be done once. If the Cactus ville Director already has volunteers on board to decorate and set up each station, the Preschool Director could also tap into that assistance unless specific volunteers are available to work solely with the preschool area.

The Director is responsible for:

- · Supervising and overseeing the day-to-day operations of Cactusville Ranch
 - Supervising and encouraging Cactusville Ranch staff and volunteers
 - Coordinating and cooperating with the Cactusville Director, especially if the preschoolers are attending the Cactusville Round Up opening and closing sessions each day
 - Coordinating and cooperating with the Cactusville Chuckwagon Station Leader to plan the Cactusville Ranch snack schedule and logistics (e.g. whether to have their snack at Cactusville or at the Ranch)
- Keeping record of daily attendance, the parents/guardians who will be picking up each child, allergy or special needs, and the paperwork that will need to be submitted to the conference at the end of VBX





- · Maintaining an adequate supply of materials needed to successfully operate each station
- · Handling any emergency situations (medical, parental) that arise
- Serving as a liaison between the parents, the preschoolers, the Cactusville Director and staff, and the local pastor
- Troubleshooting any unexpected situations that arise and working with the Cactusville Director to prevent or remedy the issue
- Potentially leading out in the entire Cactusville Ranch program if the number of Li'l Cowpokes is ten or fewer
- · Ultimately, everything that pertains to Cactusville Ranch!

Station Leaders (four) — Each of these four volunteers will be totally in charge of an area (station). This includes managing decorations, materials and supplies, daily programming, volunteer staff (Ranch Hand Wranglers, etc.) who come to assist, and the children (Li'l Cowpokes) while they are at your station.

Station leaders are responsible for:

- · Setting up and decorating their areas
- · Providing the props and supplies they need on a daily basis
- · Memorizing as much of the script as possible so they aren't tied to the page
- Taking care of program special features such as making contact and arrangements with special guests, arranging special snacks, or organizing activities in addition to the daily programming
- · Keeping the children safe and protected at all times
- Tearing down their area, taking care of post-VBX paperwork, and following up with parents/ families of preschoolers
- Leading out in the Round Up opening and closing session if the Preschool Director decides to hold the Round Up at Cactusville Ranch (at least two people must do this)

Ranch Hand Wranglers – There should be two Ranch Hand Wranglers for every group of Li'l Cowpokes, or a minimum of one Ranch Hand Wrangler for every 4-5 children. These volunteers, be they young or old, are the heartbeat of the Ranch. They are with the children from the moment they arrive until they go home.

Ranch Hand Wranglers are responsible for:

- Helping the Li'l Cowpokes rotate from station to station
- Helping the Li'l Cowpokes stay on task during activities and stay attentive (as much as possible) during stories or skits
- Assisting Station Leaders with anything that needs to be done at the station their group is visiting (since there are two Ranch Hand Wranglers for each small group of preschoolers, they can take turns assisting the Station Leaders so that one Ranch Hand Wrangler always remains in close contact with their small group)

Point to Ponder

If the Cactusville Ranch schedule is set up so that all children go to one station simultaneously and then rotate as an entire group from station to station, the Station Leaders who are not actively leading out at the moment can serve as Assistants to the Station Leader who is currently working with the children.





- Keeping the children safe and protected at all times
- Keeping their group of Li'l Cowpokes with them at all times until a parent or guardian comes to pick them up at the end of each day's program
- Interacting/communicating with the Li'l Cowpokes during down time or while assisting them with an activity or craft, as well as looking for opportunities to connect with the children in general
- Maintaining a loving and gentle demeanor when speaking to and dealing with your preschoolers;
 even if you're having a bad day, leave your ill humor at the front door and model kindness,
 patience, gentleness and the other fruits of the Spirit to your children



~ Children with Special Needs ~

You may notice great diversity in skill levels among the preschool-age children that come to Cactusville Ranch, and you want to ensure that it is a safe place for everyone to experience and learn about how they are each uniquely called by God. Adding to this marvelous diversity you may also have some kids coming to the Ranch who are diagnosed with special needs, or are yet to be diagnosed. Here are some important things to remember about each of these children:

A more detailed description of specific adaptations that can be made for special needs children is available at AdventistVBX.org.

- Kids are here to learn about Jesus and how much He loves them. Show
 His grace and love through your interactions with them.
- Special needs kids have similar traits as other kids their age but may need accommodations and/ or adaptations due their disability. Some of these disabilities will be more visible than others. If possible, familiarize yourself with the nature of their disability and anticipate simple adaptations you will make to help them be most successful.
- Special needs kids may have more anxiety or less confidence regarding certain activities. They may
 respond best to gentle encouragement and clear directions of what to do or what to expect. You
 may want to give them another option/role to play in an activity.
- Special needs kids may become frustrated more easily due to their disability or because they have difficulty expressing themselves or understanding the directions. Be sure to use simple, concrete instructions; a picture communication board or schedule may be helpful.
- Kids want to be loved and accepted by others. Model your acceptance to the other children in their group, making sure they hear, see, and feel how happy you are that God brought them to VBX.
- Special needs kids may benefit from having a partner come alongside them to help understand the
 directions, give advanced warning about an upcoming transition or change in routine, participate
 in an activity or task, or assist in making accommodations for success at VBX.





A Word of Caution Regarding Competition


Competition can be a difficult experience for many children, but additional sensitivity and care should be taken for a child with a disability. They may have physical limitations that aren't immediately obvious to you, and may already experience feelings of frustration when attempting to complete physical tasks. (For example, children with ADHD or autism are frequently less coordinated than their peers.) VBX should be a positive experience for everyone, and you can ensure that it achieves this objective by using a bit of additional creativity, encouragement, and care with wording. Make sure the focus of these games or activities is not on who finishes first or whose projects looks the most amazing, but on the children doing their best and learning about the theme of the day. Use encouraging words and verbally recognize when specific efforts are put forth (e.g. "You really helped your team when you...").

Sensory breaks

If a child becomes overly excited or agitated, taking a break to participate in an alternate way such as a coach, cheerleader or teacher's assistant may be helpful. If a sensory break is needed, a trip to the Sunflower Oasis could be the perfect solution (see the VBX Director's Guide). If that is not available, you may want to create an area in your preschool room that provides soothing sensory activities.

Suggested Soothing Sensory Objects

Some soothing objects we suggest you include in your sensory area are containers of dried pasta, beans, or rice with hidden plastic toys inside (this may not be appropriate if the children put things in their mouth), soft blankets, a bean bag chair, stretchy putty or stress balls, textured foam puzzle mats, a play tunnel to crawl through, a play tent or large cardboard box to climb into and reduce lighting and visual stimuli, exercise resistance bands, a weighted ball to roll, ankle weights, a weighted stuffed animal, and noise-cancelling headphones.







Preschool Safety Tips

Making Cactusville Ranch safe for the Lil' Cowpokes

- Inspect your room and remove any small objects or sharp furniture that could harm your Li'l
 Cowpokes. It's just good plain ol' cowpoke wisdom to remove anything smaller than a 50-cent
 piece, just in case you have children who are younger than three years old wandering through the
 Ranch.
- If you plan to take your Li'l Cowpokes outside, prearrange an area with a small fence for boundaries. If you church doesn't have a fenced-in area, you may want to mark off an area with a rope border, a hay bale border, or colorful cones. Always point out the boundaries to your Li'l Cowpokes..
- Make sure all Li'l Cowpokes stay together with their Ranch Hand Wranglers. When leaving the
 Cactusville Ranch to go outside or to other activities, Ranch Hand Wranglers should have their Li'l
 Cowpokes hold onto their rope. Never, never, never pull or jerk the rope while they are grasping it.
 Those actions could cause your Li'l Cowpokes to stumble and fall.
- Go over the details of release time with your volunteers. Li'l Cowpokes should only be released to
 a designated parent or caregiver. Get to know your parents and caregivers so that if an unfamiliar
 adult comes to pick up a child, you will know it immediately. Check and double check the
 registration forms to ensure that the adult picking up each child is listed on the registration form.





Director's Overview

**** Target Audience**

In Cactusville we offer special programming for our smallest participants. These are the Li'l Cowpokes, ages three to five. While the Buckaroos travel through the mining town of Cactusville and rotate from station to station, the Li'l Cowpokes are just out of town at the Cactusville Ranch. Here, even the littlest learners participate in activities which help solidify the Bible stories in their minds. They repeat the Daily Call, memorize scripture, pray, play games, make crafts that reinforce each day's theme, and enjoy a light snack. Each day they are putting their discoveries about God into practice. This manual gives you the rip roarin' Cactusville Ranch tips and tools you need to make the most of every second with your Li'l Cowpokes! We have partnered with preschool specialists to design a format that gives preschoolers a little less structure and more time spent engaged in hands-on activities. These age-specific modifications produce smoother transitions and an environment where they feel free to wiggle and giggle! Leaders will love the interactive format! Every activity, song, and story has been field-tested for age appropriateness and designed with your Li'l Cowpokes in mind. Yee-haw! Get ready for a knee-slappin', toe tappin', Bible learnin' time with your Li'l Cowpokes at the Cactusville Ranch!

Scheduling Options - Big Picture

Cactusville Ranch comes with two broad scheduling options.

Option #1

Li'l Cowpokes begin their adventures with the Buckaroos at the Cactusville Round Up, where they sing and do fun motions to exciting spirit-filled songs created to introduce kids to important concepts they will be learning that day. Every day the kids will meet a new Cactusville Critter who presents the Daily Call, demonstrating a specific way they are called to follow Jesus. They also get to meet Sheriff Dusty and his trusty deputies, Crusty and Digger, who help them memorize the Gold Nugget and teach other important Biblical truths through entertaining and amusing skits. From there, the Buckaroos begin their journey through the various stations in Cactusville and the Li'l Cowpokes mosey on over to the Cactusville Ranch for their station activities. Later, they return to Cactusville for the Round Up closing session where they'll sing more songs and learn fun facts about this year's VBX mission project, Operation Wheels.





Option #2

Your Li'l Cowpokes go straight to Cactusville Ranch, where they participate in their own rip roarin' Round Up opening and closing sessions.

Both scheduling options include:

- Bible and prayer activities at Campfire Stories at Sunset Canyon
- Craft activities at the Trading Post
- · Snack activities at the Chuckwagon
- Games and sensory activities at the Wild Horse Corral

Cactusville Ranch is designed to operate for three hours each day. It is suggested that the Li'l Cowpokes spend 30 minutes at each station, followed by a five minute transition time for groups to rotate between stations, take bathroom breaks, get a drink of water, etc. In order to coordinate the start and finish times for the two programs (Cactusville Ranch and Cactusville), the Round Up opening and closing sessions at Cactusville Ranch should be only 20 minutes in length. If you want a longer time period for the opening and closing programs, simply decrease the amount of time spent at the other Cactusville Ranch stations.





Meet the Critters

hese kid-friendly animals are introduced each day during the Round Up opening session. A large poster of each critter is displayed as a leader describes distinctive characteristics that uniquely qualify these animals to announce the Daily Call. The critters provide a visual link to the Daily Call, which illustrates a specific way children are called to follow Jesus.

Here are the names of the five critters along with a brief description of their special attributes.

Day 1 ★ Tarantula Tammy

If Tarantula Tammy could talk, she might say...

"I am a very hairy spider, or arachnid, and I have a whole lot of relatives (more than 800!) that live all over the world. Some people are afraid of me because I look so hairy, but most of my relatives are harmless to humans. In fact, some people like to keep me as a pet! Did you know that tarantulas come in all sizes? We can be as small as the tip of your thumb or as large as a dinner plate when all our legs are fully extended. Speaking of legs, I have eight of them! At the end of each leg I have retractable claws that help me hold on tight while I climb. I am very impressive to look at. I may look different but God made me for a special purpose! He called me to be different!"



Day 2 * Prairie Dog Pete

Prairie Dogs are part of big family groups or clans that all work together to take care of each other.

If Prairie Dog Pete could talk, he might say...

"You are probably very familiar with some of my relatives—squirrels, chipmunks, and marmots. Did you know that I am a vegetarian, and I only eat herbs and grasses? I also love to slurp up the water that drips from plants. Yummy! I live in tunnels with underground rooms. Why, I might even live under Cactusville! During the colder months, I take a very long nap that usually lasts from January to April! Even though I sleep a long time, that doesn't mean I move slowly when I'm awake. I can run 35 miles an hour if I have to! I live with my large family. When there is danger, I quickly sound the alarm to warn my family with my high-pitched yips and barks. God has called me to be faithful...faithful to my prairie dog family!"



"A chuckwalla is a large lizard that belongs to the iguana family. You can find me, the common chuckwalla, in the deserts of the Southwest, in places like Cactusville! I am not fat, but I have a stocky body with loose folds of skin around my neck and shoulders. I also have a thick tail covered with tough scales. I grow to be as long as 18 inches, but some of my chuckwalla relatives in other parts of the world are as long as 30 inches! Yee-haw! That's almost as long as a yardstick! Most of my diet consists of plants and flowers, although I occasionally eat an insect or two. I especially love to eat the yellow desert flowers! I'm always looking for a sunny spot on a rock where I can sit and soak up the heat. I feel the best when my

for a sunny spot on a rock where I can sit and soak up the heat. I feel the best when my body temperature warms up to 105 degrees! All that heat gives me energy. My favorite place to get warm is on a nice rock in the sun. Sometimes other chuckwallas try to keep me off of my favorite rock, but I forgive them. I will gladly share my rock with you. God has called me to forgive. Did I hurt your feelings by running away and hiding? I'm so sorry; please forgive me. I will gladly share my rock with you."





Day 4 ★ Pack Mule Patty

If Patty could talk, she might say...

"I carry heavy loads on my back or in side saddlebags as I cross steep slippery slopes or climb narrow rocky trails. Some of my bigger pack mule friends can carry as much as 360 pounds! My four legs are strong and I can go places where it would be difficult for a wagon to go. I am even stronger than a horse and I can go for miles and miles without having to stop for food. Just point me in the right direction and I will go that way until it's time to stop. God has called me to serve and that is what I do best!"

Day 5 * Road Runner Roy

If Roy could talk, he might say...

"Howdy Buckaroos and Li'l Cowpokes! I am called a road runner because of my unnerving habit of running on roads straight at cars.

Road runner is my most common name, but some people call me a chaparral bird. I sit on the eggs at night, gather food for the hatchlings, and help watch over my family. I have a long tail, a distinctive head crest, and an oversized bill. From the end of my beak to the tip of my tail I am 20 to 24 inches long. God has called me to give, so that's exactly what I do!"





Step by Step Preparations

- 1. **Prayer** Pray for your team and pray for all the Li'l Cowpokes that will be coming to Cactusville Ranch.
- 2. **Arm yourself with information** Grab yourself a hot drink and a muffin! Settle in and read through this preschool director's manual. All the information you need to plan, create, and facilitate a rip-roarin' experience for your Li'l Cowpokes is right here.
- **3. Choose a station rotation option** Work with the Cactusville Director to determine how to set up your preschool schedule. You have several options to consider:

a. Option 1

If you have a small group of Li'l Cowpokes (fewer than ten), you can lead all the activities yourself. Simply rotate the entire group from one activity to the next. Recruit at least two volunteers to assist you as Ranch Hand Wranglers.

b. Option 2

If your preschool class is twenty or fewer, recruit Station
Leaders for each of the four main areas (Campfire
Stories at Sunset Canyon, Wild Horse Corral, Trading
Post, and Chuckwagon). Then subdivide your Li'l Cowpokes
into four groups with no more than five children and two
Ranch Hand Wranglers in each group. Have all preschool
groups visit each station at the same time.

c. Option 3

For preschool classes of twenty or more, recruit a leader for each of the four main stations. Form four groups of Li'l Cowpokes with no more than eight to ten children and two Ranch Hand Wranglers per group. Have the groups rotate between stations one at a time. Be sure to give each Ranch Hand Wrangler a schedule to refer to. SEE PAGE [?].

Once you have decided on your station rotation option, it's time to discuss with the Cactusville Director and the Chuckwagon Snack Leader the options for the Li'l Cowpoke Chuckwagon schedule.

Option 3 can also work for preschool classes smaller than twenty if you assign fewer Li'l Cowpokes to each group.

d. Option 1

The Cactusville Chuckwagon Snack Leader serves as Leader for both Cactusville and Cactusville Ranch, so the Li'l Cowpokes join the Buckaroos for snack time.





e. Option 2

The Cactusville Chuckwagon Snack Leader takes the daily snack to the Cactusville Ranch, so the Li'l Cowpokes can eat their snack in their own area.

- 4. Decide how to set up your Wild Horse Corral Carefully look through each station manual included in the preschool guide. At the Wild Horse Corral, children play a group game and then are free to wander and explore a variety of sensory activities. You can select several specific sensory activities for each day, or you can choose to set them all up for the entire week. Your Li'l Cowpokes will love whichever choice you make!
- 5. Create a materials and supplies list Take care of your volunteers by providing them the resources they need to be successful in planning and implementing their stations. (Check out AdventistVBX. org for extra resources.) Meet with your preschool team to review activities offered at each station and decide which materials and supplies are needed. Make a list of those items. Now it's time to plan your shopping trip! Meet with the Cactusville Director to go over your list. Let the Director know what supplies you already have on hand and what supplies you'll need to collect from church members or purchase. Some of the supplies on your list are the same as the ones needed for Cactusville, and you and the Cactusville Director can order or request them from church members at the same time. Working as a team always makes the setup smoother and more budget-friendly.
- 6. **Recruit** Work with the Cactusville Director to recruit volunteers. Working with preschoolers requires special people who love little children. That can be anyone from a young teen to a senior citizen. Be intentional and selective as you recruit for the Ranch.
- 7. Organize the staff training Work with the Cactusville Director to set a schedule for all staff training meetings. These meetings are important for two reasons: bonding with your volunteers and casting the vision for VBX. At these training meetings your volunteers will learn how Cactusville works and get useful advice on helping children enjoy their experiences in Cactusville and at Cactusville Ranch. If your volunteers cannot make the training meeting, encourage them to watch the promo video on AdventistVBX.org and look at each station's decorations.
- 8. Take advantage of the registration tools Your Cactusville Director has the option to use the VBSPlus online registration tool located at AdventistVBX.org. VBSPlus is an online VBS event management system that makes the job of VBX Director a breeze! It stores all your registration information in one place and promotes your VBX at the same time.

Point to Ponder

If you choose to have your own Round Up opening and closing at the Cactusville Ranch, several of your Station Leaders can team up to lead these sessions. That way you won't need to have a separate opening and closing Leader—a decision that will greatly simplify the recruiting process!





Familiarize yourself with the registration
 process — Instruct the registration workers to put
 preschoolers and pre-K children into mixed-age preschool
 groups, not with the Buckaroos.

Registration for Cactusville Ranch is a two-step procedure. Your Li'l Cowpokes first register at the main registration table and receive their bandana and nametag. Each pair of Ranch Hand Wranglers has a rope with bandanas tied to it that signify the color of their group; for example, the blue group has a rope with blue bandanas tied to it. The Li'l Cowpokes hold onto this rope as their Ranch Hand Wranglers lead them to Cactusville. Once at the Ranch, the door greeter checks their names off a list provided by the main registration workers.

10. Decide what to wear — Plan your wardrobe! Of course Western outfits are always appropriate. Adult and youth-size staff t-shirts are available at AdventistVBX.org. Designate a specific color bandana for each pair of Ranch Hand Wranglers and red bandanas for your Red Band'dana praise team. Add a Western hat and/or boots and you're all set! Yee-haw!

Remind your registration staff that the activities in Cactusville Ranch stations are designed for children who haven't been to kindergarten yet. Children will be excited to return each day to participate in these age-appropriate activities and will be much more likely to understand, remember, and apply the Biblical

Director's To Do List During Cactusville Ranch

- If you are joining the Cactusville Buckaroos for Round Up opening and closing, ask the Red Band'dana Leader to reserve places up front for the Li'l Cowpokes each day. You may want to post a sign that says "Li'l Cowpokes" at your designated area. The preschoolers won't be able to read the sign, but the older kids will!
- Spend time with your volunteers. Meet 15 minutes before your Li'l Cowpokes arrive to have a
 short team worship and to talk about that day's Bible story and how it applies to each activity. (For
 example, you could discuss how the daily Bible theme can be reinforced at the Wild Horse Corral
 Sensory Station.) Give the Ranch Hand Wranglers and Station Leaders practical suggestions and
 ideas on how to make the Bible theme come alive at each station.
- Check in with the registration staff each day. Pick up extra forms for Li'l Cowpokes who register during the VBX week. Assign one of your volunteer staff to stay and greet latecomers at the registration table. Once the latecomers are registered and assigned a group's bandana color, help the Li'l Cowpokes find the right Ranch Hand Wranglers and group.
- Empower and equip your Ranch Hand Wranglers. Provide them with pre-packed Ranch Hand
 Wrangler bags containing wet wipes in a resealable plastic bag, hand sanitizer, a permanent
 marker, and a rope (about 10' long) with their color bandanas tied to it about two feet apart. Li'l
 Cowpokes will hold on to the rope as they travel from registration to Cactusville Ranch and, if
 needed, as they rotate to each station. Remind your Ranch Hand Wranglers that they are important
 to their Li'l Cowpokes. They are familiar faces for the Li'l Cowpokes who show signs of separation
 anxiety.
- Learn your Li'l Cowpokes' names and warmly welcome them as they arrive. Make sure each Li'l
 Cowpoke feels welcomed and loved! Some of your Li'l Cowpokes may feel anxious about leaving
 their parents or caregivers, so your smiling, welcoming presence is important. Give each one a yeehaw and a high five! Learning your Li'l Cowpokes' names is a super simple connection that helps
 build relationships and reinforce the fact that each Li'l Cowpoke has been specially called to follow
 Jesus. Yee-haw!
- Help the Li'l Cowpokes to learn the Gold Nugget, the memory verse for Cactusville. At the Ranch, the Li'l Cowpokes will learn the first portion of the same verse all week long, which says, "...(Jesus) who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." (2 Timothy 1:9, NKJV). Encourage your staff to learn the motions as seen on AdventistVBX.org. Your staff's excitement and joy will be contagious, motivating the Li'l Cowpokes to participate and learn the Gold Nugget themselves. You are helping them hide God's Word in their hearts, something that will stay with them as they grow older.





- Introduce your Li'l Cowpokes to the daily Cactusville Critter during the Round Up opening session.
 The Cactusville Critters remind kids of the Daily Call. Your Li'l Cowpokes will receive each day's Cactusville Critter cut-out at the Round Up closing session.
- Designate a table to hold and display each day's crafts. Also, specify an area where the Ranch Hand Wranglers can place their kids' take-home works of art.
- Purchase a cowbell for you to ring when it is time to rotate. Teach the Li'l Cowpokes to recognize the sound as a signal to stop what they are doing and either stand in a line or hold their Ranch Hand Wrangler's rope so they can transition to the next activity.
- If you decide to do your own Round Up opening and closing, coordinate with the Cactusville Director when the Red Band'danas need to come and lead the praise music at Cactusville Ranch.

Opening at the Ranch - Day 1

[Cue the Music DVD and have it ready.]

Welcome to Cactusville Ranch, Li'l Cowpokes! I'm glad you're here today. We will be spending the next five days together having lots of fun learning about the different ways God calls us to follow Jesus. Since we've just arrived at the Ranch, I'm curious to know what kind of animals we have around here. (Look dramatically around the room.) Do you see any animals? [Encourage kids to answer.]

Oh yeah! I see a (horse) too! Look over there; it's a (chicken). We do have all kinds of amazing animals here at Cactusville Ranch.

Let's play a little game. When I count to three, I want you to make the sound of your favorite animal that you see here at the Ranch. Ready? One...two...three.... [Cup one hand to your ear to show you're listening as the kids make animal sounds.]

[Ring the cowbell.] Oh, that was fun! And noisy too! [Hold up the cowbell.] Does anyone know what this is? That's right! It's a bell, a cowbell! A mommy cow wears a bell like this around her neck so her owner can hear her moving around and find her easily. I'm going to use this cowbell when I need to get your attention. So every time you hear me ring this bell, I need you to stop whatever you're doing, look at me, and listen carefully, OK? [Wait for kids to respond.] Let's practice. Everyone get up and start wiggling and shaking your bodies. [Demonstrate.] When I ring the cowbell I want you to stop immediately and look at me. [Ring the cowbell. Repeat several times.] Good job! Thank you for being good listeners! You may sit down again.





[Lower your voice expectantly and bend down to look at the Li'l Cowpokes.] Did you know that God calls you and me every day? Yes, He really does! Right here [touch your temple]. This week we are going to learn to listen to His holy calling and find out what He is calling us to do.

Every day as we meet here at Cactusville Ranch you will have some special people helping you. Those special people are called Ranch Hand Wranglers. Can you say that with me? [Pause and practice with the kids.] Great job! [Give a thumbs-up sign.] If you need anything, one of your Ranch Hand Wranglers will help you. You'll also have some friends, other Li'l Cowpokes just like yourself, who will travel with you from one fun activity to another. Can you say, "Yee-haw"? Let's all say it together! (Lead the kids in saying, "Yee-haw!" and pump one fist upwards as you say it.]

Meet and Greet Activity

You've already met your Ranch Hand Wranglers, so let's give them high-fives and say, "Howdy pard'ner!" [Pause while they do this.] Nice job, Li'l Cowpokes!

Let's play another game. Listen carefully while I tell you what to do. Ranch

Hand Wranglers, make a circle with your group, shoulder to shoulder with your feet about as far apart as your shoulders. [Pause to give the groups time to form circles.] Everybody ready? In your Ranch Hand Wrangler bag is a ball. Get it out. One of your Ranch Hand Wranglers will roll the ball to you and when you have the ball in your hands, I want you to say your name. Ready, Ranch Hand Wranglers?

Ready, set, go! [Ranch Hand Wranglers play the game with their group, helping the smaller kids say their name and roll the ball back. Allow 5 minutes to play the game.]

The kids
should always
roll the ball back to
one of the Ranch
Hand Wranglers after
saying their name.
This way the Ranch
Hand Wranglers keep
control of the game.

That was fun! Now it's time for your Ranch Hand Wranglers to put the ball back in the bag.

Gold Nugget

Let's have the Yellow Bandana group come up and help us learn the Gold Nugget along with hand motions. [Pause while the group comes up.]

"(Jesus)...who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." 2 Timothy
1:9. [Say the words to the Gold Nugget slowly and lead out in the hand motions so the kids can follow. Repeat three times.]



Thank you, Yellow Bandana crew, for helping us learn our Gold Nugget. Tomorrow we'll call up another group to help us.

Sing-along and Critter Time

It's time for our Red Band'dana song leader to come up and help us learn some fun songs! Are you ready? Yee-haw! [Assign one of the other station leaders the job of being the Red Band'dana song leader.]

Let's sing our theme song, We are Called. [Turn on the Music DVD and teach the kids the chorus and motions.]

Next let's sing I Have Decided to Follow Jesus. [Teach the motions; give each child a scarf and show them how to slowly wave the scarf back and forth while singing.]





Each day this week we are going to have a special guest who will tell us a way that God calls us. How many of you have pets? [Raise your hand and pause while kids raise theirs.] What kind of pets do you have? [Pause while kids call out responses. Have an assistant bring out a poster or the large cutout of Tarantula Tammy to center stage for everyone to see.] Let me introduce you to today's special guest, Tarantula Tammy. [Point to poster or cutout.) Can you say, "Hi, Tarantula Tammy"? [Pause and repeat the words slowly, so the children can say it with you. "Hi, Tarantula Tammy!"] Not only is she a very unusual kind of pet; she is our Cactusville Critter for today. As you learn a little about Tammy, you will also discover today's special calling.

Tammy is a big, hairy spider! Did you know that God created Tammy with four sets of legs? That's right! That means Tammy has eight legs! Let's pretend our fingers are Tammy's legs. Can you wiggle your fingers like a spider's legs? [Lead the children in wiggling all the fingers on both hands.] That's not all. God gave Tammy claws that can go in and out [demonstrate by curling your fingers in and then extending them] so that when she climbs tall trees she can hang on tight! Can you pretend your fingers are claws and make them go in and out? [Lead the children in alternately curling and extending their fingers.] Now let's pretend we are tarantulas climbing a big, tall tree. [Lead the children in wiggling their fingers while moving them up and down.]

Tarantula Tammy may look different from other spiders you've seen, but God made her that way for a special reason. He called her to be different! And Li'l Cowpokes, just like Tammy Tarantula, you have been called to be different. Throughout the day you may hear a leader say, "We are called." Every time you hear someone say those words, you need to answer, "Called to be different," and shout, "Yee-haw!" Let's practice this a few times. [Call out, "We are called!" Kids respond, "Called to be different. Yee-haw!" Practice several times. Tip: Each time you want the kids to respond, cup one hand to your ear like you're listening.]

Nice job, Li'l Cowpokes. I think you are all practiced up, so let's sing another song. This song can help us get excited about being different for Jesus!

Let's sing We are Different. [Teach the motions and show the children how to turn round and round in a circle, clap their hands, and stomp their feet at the appropriate times.)

Prayer Time

[In preparation for prayer, teach this little song and its motions to the children.] As we get ready to pray, let's sing this little song.

Let's sing | Listen to the Lord to the tune of It's Raining, It's Pouring [adapted by Francini Reis].

I listen [right hand on right ear; keep your hand there]
I listen [left hand on left ear]
I listen to my Lord [both hands on both ears]
I fold my hands [fold hands]
And I close my eyes [close eyes]
Now I'm ready to talk to Jesus

Closing at the Ranch - Day 1

Howdy Li'l Cowpokes! Today has been a busy day here at Cactusville Ranch. Yes sireee! (Bend down, lean forward, and look intently at the children.) Did you have fun learning about John the Baptist? [Pause and encourage them to answer loudly by your gestures.] Whoa there now! That was purty loud! God called John the Baptist to be different and just like John the Baptist, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond. Kids: "Called to be different. Yee-haw!" Have another station leader help lead the children in the response.]

Sing-along Time and Operation Wheels

It's time for some more singing, Li'l Cowpokes. Come on up, Red Band'dana praise leader! [Cue Music DVD.] Let's start with We are Called. [Include the motions.]

God has called us to be different by being kind and loving to all our friends! Cross your arms and put a hand on each shoulder [American Sign Language sign for "love"] and say, "I love all my friends!" [Pause while kids cross their arms, then lead them in saying, "I love all my friends!"] Now let's sing about how Jesus loves all the children all over the world.

Let's sing Jesus Loves the Little Children [lyrics modified by Shane B.]. [Stop in the middle of the song to teach the children the new words. Practice that line several times.]

Jesus loves the little children, all the children of the world.

[Say the new words with job and sparkle and ask the children to repeat them.]

Every color, shape, and size, they are precious in His eyes.

Jesus loves the little children of the world.

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? What kind of animal wears this bell? [Pause and allow children to answer.] That's right, a cow wears this kind of bell. Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

Sit down right where you are. We are going to watch a DVD that shows some of our friends that came to our country from far, far away; friends that need our help! Today we are going to meet Jessica. [Play DVD. While DVD is playing bring the Operation Wheels bucket to the front.]

We learned that our friend Jessica is from a country far, far away called Burma. Jessica and her family need our help. Your Ranch Hand Wrangler is going to give each of you some money. When I call the color of the bandana that your group is wearing, you can bring up your money and put it in the bucket. Let's see how heavy we can make our bucket! [Call up the groups one at a time and watch as they put their money in the bucket. Then call a Li'l Cowpoke to come up front to hold the bucket.)

Whoa! This bucket 'shore is heavy! Thank you kindly, Lil' Cowpokes, for showing your love to our friends!

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? When you hear the cowbell ring, remember it means that we are going to do something different.





Ranch Hand Wrangler Activity [Prepare the Ranch Animals game and have it ready for the Ranch Hand Wranglers. See AdventistVBX.org for a free download of the game and instructions.]

It's time to circle up, Li'l Cowpokes. Sit in a circle with your Ranch Hand Wranglers. You get to play a game with your friends and your Ranch Hand Wranglers called Ranch Animals.

Ranch Hand Wranglers, please give a farm animal game piece to each Li'l Cowpoke in your group. [Continue speaking while they hand out the game pieces.] Listen carefully while I tell you how this game is played.

Game Instructions:

- 1. When your Ranch Hand Wrangler says the name of a farm animal that you might see at Cactusville Ranch, all of you need to make the sound of that animal. Here's an example. If your Ranch Hand Wrangler says, "Cow," you need to say, "Moooooo." Let's all try that together. [Have the children practice saying "Moooooo" before continuing with the instructions.]
- 2. Then the Li'l Cowpoke that is holding the cow game piece [hold it up so everyone can see it] will come up and place it on the game board on top of a Velcro dot so it sticks to the board. [Demonstrate how to place the game piece on a Velcro dot.] By the time we finish the game, all the farm animals will be stuck to the board.

[Play the Ranch Animals game for 10 minutes. Ranch Hand Wranglers lead out in the game while the station leaders circulate throughout the area to assist or offer encouraging comments as the children make the animal sounds and get up to place the game pieces on the board.]



And I close my eyes [close eyes]

Now I'm ready to talk to Jesus

Opening at the Ranch - Day 2

[Cue the Music DVD and have it ready.]

Welcome back to Cactusville Ranch, Li'l Cowpokes. I'm glad you came today. Oh, we had a lot of fun yester-day learning about John the Baptist and how he wasn't afraid to be different for God. We also learned that God has called us to be different for Him. Today we get to learn another special way that God calls us to follow Jesus. I can hardly wait to find out what it is! [Clap your hands.] And we will get to hear another Bible story. Yippee! I wonder who it will be about today? Today is going to be such a fun day! Are you ready to get started? [Pause while the children respond.]

[Ring cowbell.] Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

Meet and Greet Activity

Give your Ranch Hand Wrangler a high-five and say, "Yee-haw!" Let's get ready to play our game. Listen carefully...here are the instructions. Ranch Hand Wranglers, get your group in a circle with you, standing shoulder to shoulder. Everybody ready? In your Ranch Hand Wrangler bag is a ball. Get it out. Your Ranch Hand Wrangler will toss you a ball and when you have the ball in your hands I want you to say your name. Ready, Ranch Hand Wranglers? One...two...three...go! [Ranch Hand Wranglers play the game with their group, helping the smaller kids say their name and throw the ball back. Allow 5 minutes to play the game.]

That was fun! Now it's time for the Ranch Hand Wranglers to put the ball back in their bag.





Since today we will be learning to listen and follow God's calling, I want to play Follow the Leader with you. If you don't know this game, it's very easy. All you need to do is to follow your leader. I'm going to be your leader [or call one of the Ranch Hand Wrangler groups to lead out]. Now we are going to learn a new song called I Will Follow. [Lead kids in singing and doing the motions.]

Now I want to introduce you to our Cactusville Critter for today [point to poster or standup]. And it has a fun name: Prairie Dog Pete! Can you say that with me? Prairie Dog Pete! That was great! Pete is a chubby little prairie dog! Did you know that God provided Pete with a loud, shrill voice to use to warn his friends of danger? Pete just lifts up his chin and starts to yip and bark.

Let's pretend we are prairie dogs. Ready? [Make sounds to imitate a prairie dog.] Yipppppyip, bark, bark! [As you are yipping and barking, shake your head up and down.] Whoa! You sounded just like prairie dogs! That was really good!

Opening at the Ranch - Day 3

[Cue the Music DVD and have it ready. Place the Mystery Bag somewhere on stage where you can easily reach it.]

Welcome back to Cactusville Ranch, Li'l Cowpokes! I'm glad you came today. [Give high-fives to several of the children.] We had a lot of fun yesterday learning about Abraham and our message was that God has called us to be faithful. We are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for the kids to respond. Kids: "Called to be faithful! Yee-haw!"]

That was great! Give your Ranch Hand Wrangler a high-five!

Now we are going to learn a new call and response for today! [Clap your hands.] Are you ready? Every time you hear someone say, "W" you say, "Called to forgive. Yee-haw!" Let's practice: We are called! [Dramatically point to the children. Kids: "Called to be faithful! Yee-haw!"] [Slap your knee.] You are mighty smart kiddos!

Today in our Bible story station, we will be learning about someone who struggled to learn to forgive, but he could do it, because God called him to forgive.

[Ring the cowbell.] Remember what it means when I ring the cowbell? Who can tell me? [Pause and let children answer.] That's right! Every time you hear me ring this bell, I need you to stop whatever you're doing, look at me, and listen carefully, OK? Let's practice. Everyone get up and start wiggling and shaking your bodies [demonstrate]. [Ring the cowbell. Repeat several times.] Good job! Thank you for being good listeners! You may sit down now with your Ranch Hand Wrangler.

Meet and Greet Activity

Give your Ranch Hand Wrangler a high-five and say, "Yee-haw!" Now we are going to play a game. Listen carefully...here are the instructions.





Ranch Hand Wranglers, get your group in a circle with you, shoulder to shoulder. [Pause to give the groups time to form circles.] Everybody ready? In your Ranch Hand Wrangler bag is a ball. Get it out. One of your Ranch Hand Wranglers will roll the ball to you and when you have the ball in your hands, I want you to say your name. Ready, Ranch Hand Wranglers? Ready, set, go! [Ranch Hand Wranglers play the game with their group, helping the smaller kids say their name and roll the ball back. Allow 5 minutes to play the game.]

That was fun! Now it's time for your Ranch Hand Wranglers to put the ball back in the bag.

The kids should always roll the ball back to one of the Ranch Hand Wranglers after saying their names. This way the Ranch Hand Wranglers keep control of the game.

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different. That game was fun! Now it's time for your Ranch Hand Wrangler to put the ball back in the bag.

[Start setting up a very simple obstacle course on stage: jump from carpet square to carpet square or stretch out masking tape in two rows close together – 8-12' long.] Do you wonder what I am doing? [Wait for kids to respond.] It's an obstacle course! I know you are fast...and strong! Today we are going to do an obstacle course where we help each other and if someone slips off the line that's OK! Everyone line up with a partner, two by two. (Wait for all kids to find a partner.) Now...hold hands. That's right...perfect! As you go through the obstacle course you are going to help each other! Don't let go! Hurray! [Allow all groups to complete the obstacle course.] Everyone did a great job! We are called! [Cup your hand on one ear and wait for kids to respond. Kids: "Called to forgive! Yee-haw!"]

Gold Nugget

The Bible is full of treasure! Look right here [hold up an open Bible] in 2 Timothy 1:9. It says, "(Jesus)...who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..."



Wow! That is good news! Let me see…let's have the Purple Bandana group come and help us with the motions. [Teach the motions.] That was fun. Let's do it again! [Repeat memory verse with motions.]

Sing-along and Critter Time

It's time for our Red Band'dana song leader to come up and help us learn some fun songs! Are you ready? Let me hear you say, "Yee-haw!" Here they come!

Are you ready to sing our theme song? I know I am! Let's sing We are Called. [Sing and do motions.]

Next we're going to sing **We are Different**. It's time to pick a partner to [swing round and round or turn round and round], clap your hands, and stomp your feet. Let's go! [Sing and do motions.]

Now let's sing **Forgive**...because forgiveness is what we are learning about today! Just like we helped each other in the obstacle course and didn't worry if we slipped, we love each other and forgive each other! [Sing and do motions.]

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.





Sit with me. [Pat carpet or floor around you and in front of you. Pick up the Mystery Bag with a stuffed dog inside.]

Listen carefully and see if you can guess what is inside my bag. [Pantomime a dog's bark, trying not to move your lips at all. Call one of the children up to reach in the bag and pull out the mystery animal.] You guessed it! Hurray! It's a puppy! [Ask volunteer to go back to their group.]

Dogs are very special creatures. Who has a puppy or a dog at home? [Wait and listen to children's responses.] If you have one at home, you know that dogs are always happy to see you. They lick your face [demonstrate puppy kisses with the stuffed animal] and they love to follow you wherever you go! Oh, and they loooove to have you pet them. [Pet the stuffed dog gently.] Did you know that dogs are very forgiving? Yes! They are! Even when we get mad at them, they come back to you wagging their tails, licking you, and wiggling with joy! [Demonstrate tail wagging and licking with the stuffed animal.] We are called! [Motion to kids to respond. Kids: "Called to forgive. Yee-haw!"]

[Lower your voice expectantly and bend down to look at the Li'l Cowpokes.] Did you know that God calls you and me every day? Yes, He really does! This week we are going to learn to listen to His holy calling and find out what He is calling us to do.

But first let's play a game! Everyone get in two big circles. [Ranch Hand Wranglers can help form circles and then sit with their kids in the circle.] **We are going to play a game called Puppy, Puppy, Forgive!** [This game is similar to Duck, Duck, Goose.]

[Select one child from each circle to be the Puppy. The Puppy walks around the circle, tapping each child on the head, saying, "Puppy" until he or she decides to tape someone and say, "Forgive!" Say, "Run, Puppy, run!" and both children run around the circle and sit together in one of the open spaces. Now select another child to be the Puppy.]

Yee-haw! We are called! [Cup your hand over one ear and encourage children to respond. Kids: "Called to forgive. Yee-haw!"]

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

That was a fun game. Now we'll catch our breath! Everyone go back to your Ranch Hand Wrangler group.

I want to introduce you to Chuck the Chuckwalla. He is our Cactusville Critter for today [point to poster or standup]. Our Cactusville Critter helps us remember that we are called! (Motion to kids to respond. Kids: "Called to forgive. Yee-haw!"]

And our critter has a fun name too! Chuck the Chuckwalla. Can you say "chuckwalla" with me? Let's say it faster! Can you say it even faster? Chuckwalla! Chuck is a great big lizard! [Open your arms wide.] You know, a chuckwalla is a fast runner but he likes to lay in the sun the best.

Let's lay on the ground like a lizard. [Demonstrate.] Roll this way...now roll that way...the sun feels really good! Can you wiggle back and forth? OK...you can sit up now. [Smile at the Li'l Cowpokes.] It was fun pretending to be Chuck the Chuckwalla!

Chuck the Chuckwalla reminds us of our Gold Nugget Bible verse, 2 Timothy 1:9: "(Jesus)...who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." [Teach motions and repeat.]





Prayer Time

[In preparation for prayer, teach this little song and its motions to the children.] As we get ready to pray, let's sing our prayer song, I Listen to the Lord [This song is sung to the tune of It's Raining, It's Pouring, adapted by Francini Reis.]

I listen [right hand on right ear; keep your hand there]

I listen [left hand on left ear]

I listen to my Lord [both hands on both ears]

I fold my hands [fold hands]

And I close my eyes [close eyes]

Now I'm ready to talk to Jesus

Sing-along Time and Operation Wheels

Howdy Lil' Cowpokes! Today has been busy here in Cactusville Ranch...yes sireee! [Bend down and lean forward, looking at the Li'l Cowpokes.] Did you have fun learning about Joseph? [Encourage the children to answer loudly.] Whoa there now...that was purdy loud! God called Joseph to forgive and he listened to what God asked him to do! Just like Joseph, God is calling you and me to be forgiving too!

Ready to turn round and round, clap your hands, and stomp your feet? Come on up, Red Band'danas!

Let's start by singing We are Different. [Teach motions, pick a partner to swing round and round or just turn round individually, clap your hands, and stomp your feet.]

Now let's sing our theme song, We are Called. [Sing and do motions.]

Next let's sing Forgive. [Sing and do motions.]

[Cue Operation Wheels Day 3 DVD.]

God has called us to forgive when our feelings are hurt. Hold out one hand and brush your fingers across your palm and say, "I want to be forgiving to all my friends!" [Allow time for kids to do this.]

Jesus loves all children! That means you and me! Let's sing **Jesus Loves** the Little Children [with lyrics adapted by Shane B.].

Jesus loves the little children, all the children of the world.

Every color, shape, and size, they are precious in His eyes.

Jesus loves the little children of the world.

When you brush your fingertips along the length of your base-hand palm twice, that is the American Sign Language sign for "forgive." If you use a single, large, firm movement it means to pardon or release from obligation





[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

Sit down right where you are. We are going to watch a DVD that shows some of our friends who moved here from far, far away; friends that need our help! Today we are going to meet June Lily who is from Malaysia.

[Play video. While DVD is playing bring the Operation Wheels bucket to the front.]

We learned that our friend June Lily is from Malaysia, a country far, far away. And she needs our help. Your Ranch Hand Wrangler is going to give you some money. When I call your color group you can bring your money and put it in the bucket. Let's see how heavy we can get our bucket!

[Call a Lil' Cowpoke up front to and ask them to show how strong they are by flexing their arm muscle.] **Wow! Look at those muscles! I'm sure** [child's name] **is strong enough to hold our Operation Wheels bucket!** [Have the child lift the bucket and then set it down.]

Wowwee! This bucket sure is heavy! Thank you, Li'l Cowpokes, for loving our friends from far, far away!

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

It's time to circle up, Li'l Cowpokes. Sit in a circle around your Ranch Hand Wrangler. You are going to play a game with your friends and your Ranch Hand Wrangler called Bird Food.

Ranch Hand Wrangler Activity


[Prepare game and have ready for Wranglers.]

[Show kids the game pieces. Hand out game pieces to each child. Only one child per group will have a bird game piece; the rest will have worms.] First we are going to listen to a story about Mrs. Bluebird. Mrs. Bluebird went out looking for food for her three little birdies and told them to stay in the nest. But brother decided to go out of the nest...he didn't even know how to fly yet. It's a good thing [name of Li'l Cowpoke] came along to help him back in! When he saw how worried Mrs. Bluebird was, he said, "I'm sorry; I will listen better next time." Mrs. Bluebird said, "I forgive you...now let's eat!"

Look at Mrs. Bluebird. She is feeding her three hungry little birdies...let's count them. One...two...oh my! Where is number three? Who has the other little blue bird? [Name of Li'l Cowpoke with bird game piece] does! Hurray! Can you put it back in the nest? [Have child place bird in nest.] Good job! Mrs. Bluebird was really worried about her missing blue birdie...where

did he go? Where do you think he went? [Listen to kids' responses. Nod

with agreement. Smile. Look your Li'l Cowpokes in the eyes while they are talking.] I wonder if Mrs. Bluebird was worried about him?







If you have a worm game piece, come and place it on one of the Velcro spots. [Allow 10 minutes to play game.]

Blue Birdie asked for forgiveness and Mrs. Bluebird forgave him. [Leave the worms on the board for the next day.]

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

Time to put away the Bird Food game and welcome the Red Band'danas! Yee-haw!

Let's sing Bluebird Mommy Babies Too! [Sung to the tune of Clean Up, Clean Up.]

Clean up, clean up

Bluebird mommy babies too

Clean up, clean up

Away they go, the game is through

Next let's sing our theme song, We are Called [do the motions].

That was pretty...I'm sure the angels were singing with us too! Isn't it wonderful to know that God has saved us and called us to a holy calling? Yes siree!

Prayer Time

Let's pray before we leave Cactusville Ranch. [Invite a volunteer or two or three to come and help with the motions.] Let's sing our little song that helps us get ready for prayer. It's called I Listen to the Lord. [Sung to the tune of It's Raining, It's Pouring, adapted by Francini Reis.]

I listen [right hand on right ear; keep your hand there]

I listen [left hand on left ear]

I listen to my Lord [both hands on both ears]

I fold my hands [fold hands]

And I close my eyes [close eyes]

Now I'm ready to talk to Jesus

Dear Jesus, thank You for being here with us today. Help us to listen and understand Your calling as we leave the Cactusville Ranch for today. We love you! In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

It's time to circle up, Li'l Cowpokes. Sit in a circle around your Ranch Hand Wrangler. You are going to play a game with your friends and your Ranch Hand Wrangler called Bird Nest.

[Give 10 minutes to play game.]





Ranch Hand Wrangler Activity

[Prepare game and have ready for Wranglers. You will reuse the game board from Day 3 for this game.]

[Show game to children.] Mrs. Bluebird sure does have a lot of food! Remember she was worried about brother Blue Birdie? She was worried because he was hungry and because there was a wind storm coming and she didn't want him out in the cold. Let's help Mrs. Bluebird get her nest all ready for the cold weather. I'm going to give each of you a piece of yarn that you can press into some glue on Mrs. Bluebird's nest. Let's make their nest nice and cozy!

[Give each Li'l Cowpoke a piece of yarn. Draw your glue lines on the nest. Instruct them to put their string on the line of glue, one child at a time.]



Thank you for helping Mrs. Bluebird get her nest ready for the cold weather. Feel how nice and soft it is. [Instruct children to gently pat the yarn on the nest one child at a time.]

We did a good thing by helping Mrs. Bluebird. Serving others is showing how much we love them...and this is exactly what Jesus wants us to do. Give me high-five! [High-five the kids.]

Remember our Gold Nugget? Say it with me: "Jesus...(who) has saved us and called us with a Holy calling..." 2 Timothy 1:9. [Do motions.]

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

Time to put away the Bird Nest game and welcome the Red Band'danas! Yee-haw!

Let's start by singing Worms, Yarn, and Love Too! [Sung to the tune of Clean Up, Clean Up.]
Clean up, clean up
blue birds, worms, and mommy bird
Clean up, clean up
Away they go, the game is through

[When game is all put away start theme song.] **Next we'll sing our theme song, We are Called.** [Do motions.]

That was purty...!'m'shore the angels were singing with us too! Isn't it wonderful to know that God has saved us and called us to a holy calling? Yes siree! Before we leave for today let's say our Gold Nugget one more time. [Say the Gold Nugget slowly and lead out in the hand motions so all the kids can follow.] "(Jesus)...who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." 2 Timothy 1:9.





Prayer Time

Let's pray before we leave Cactusville Ranch. [Invite a volunteer or two or three to come and help with the motions.] Let's sing our little song that helps us get ready for prayer. It's called I Listen to the Lord. [Sung to the tune of It's Raining, It's Pouring, adapted by Francini Reis.]

I listen [right hand on right ear; keep your hand there]

I listen [left hand on left ear]

I listen to my Lord [both hands on both ears]

I fold my hands [fold hands]

And I close my eyes [close eyes)

Opening at the Ranch - Day 5

[Cue the Music DVD.]

Welcome back to Cactusville Ranch, Li'l Cowpokes. I'm glad you came today. Oh, we had a lot of fun yester-day learning about Deborah and our message was that we are called! [Cup hand on one ear and encourage kids to respond. Kids: "Called to serve. Yee-haw!"] Give your Ranch Hand Wrangler a high-five! Let's say it again! We are called! [Kids: "Called to serve. Yee-haw!"] Now we are going to learn a new one for today! [Clap your hands.] Every time you hear someone say, "We are called" you are going to say, "Called to give. Yee-haw!" Let's practice: We are called! [Dramatically point to the kids. Kids: "Called to give. Yee-haw!"] [Slap your knee.) Y'er mighty smart kiddos!

[Ring cowbell.] What does the cowbell mean? Yes! All eyes on me! We are going to do something different.

Meet and Greet Activity

Give your Ranch Hand Wrangler a high-five and say, "Yee-haw!" Let's play a game. Listen carefully...here are the instructions. Ranch Hand Wranglers, get your group in a circle with you, shoulder to shoulder. Everybody ready? In your Ranch Hand Wrangler bag is a ball. Get it out. Your Ranch Hand Wrangler will toss you a ball and when you have the ball in your hands I want you to say your name. Ready, Ranch Hand Wranglers? One...two... three...go! [Ranch Hand Wranglers play the game with their group, helping the smaller kids say their name and throw the ball back. Alternative options: "Say your friend's name" or "Say your Ranch Hand Wrangler's name" or "Say Yee-haw!"]

Next let's sing What Can We Give because that is what we are going to learn about today! Jesus gives us lots and lots of love! [Cross arms over chest. Do motions.]

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

[Helpers have parachute ready.] Saying "I love you" is a nice way to talk to your family and friends. As we sing Jesus Loves Me, I want you to think about God's love for you today...because...(pause dramatically and whisper) He loves you lots and lots!

[Spread out the parachute and ask the children to hold onto the handles and the edges.] Hold on tight to the edges! We are going to sing Jesus Love Me and the parachute is going to fly! Hang on!

And it has a fun name: Road Runner Roy! Road Runner Roy is the fastest running bird ever! He is so fast that he could run right past you and you wouldn't see him! Are you a fast runner? [Allow kids to respond.] You are?

Let's pretend we are fast running birds like Roy! [Pump your arms back and forth and run in place.] Run in place, Li'l Cowpokes...just like me! Faster! Faster!

Whew! I'm all tuckered out! [Dramatically wipe your brow.] That was fast running and I think you were the fastest! Whew!

Road Runner Roy reminds us of our Gold Nugget Bible verse, 2 Timothy 1:9: "(Jesus)...who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." [Do the motions and repeat.]

Prayer Time

[In preparation for prayer, teach this little song and its motions to the children.] As we get ready to pray, let's sing our prayer song, I Listen to the Lord [This song is sung to the tune of It's Raining, It's Pouring, adapted by Francini Reis.]

I listen [right hand on right ear; keep your hand there]

I listen [left hand on left ear]

I listen to my Lord [both hands on both ears]

[Motion to kids to respond. Kids: "Called to give. Yee-haw!"] That means Jesus gives us love...all the time! Wrap your arms around yourself and say, "I love you too, Jesus!"

Sing-along Time and Operation Wheels

Are you ready to turn round and round, clap your hands, and stomp your feet? Come on up, Red Band'danas!

Let's start by singing We are Different. [Teach motions, pick a partner to swing round and round or just turn round individually, clap your hands, and stomp your feet.]

Next let's sing our theme song, We are Called. [Do motions.]

Now let's sing What Can We Give. [Do motions.]

Let's sing Let's Serve. [Do motions.]

[Place basket with scarves within easy reach. Hand out scarves to children to gently wave.] Now we're going to pick





up our scarves and sing I Have Decided to Follow Jesus [Wave scarves gently. Collect scarves when the song is over..].

[Cue Operation Wheels Day 5 DVD.]

God has called us to give when we see someone who needs to be loved. Cross your arms over your chest and say, "I want to give love to all my friends!"

Jesus loves all children! That means you and me! Let's sing **Jesus loves** the Little Children [with lyrics adapted by Shane B.].

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

Sit down right where you are. We are going to watch a DVD that shows some of our friends who moved here from far, far away; friends that need our love and friendship! Today we are going to meet Gesell from Syria.

[Play DVD. While DVD is playing, bring the Operation Wheels bucket to the front.]

We learned that our friend Gesell is from Syria, a country far, far away. Gisell and her friends need our friendship and love. Your Ranch Hand Wrangler is going to give you some money. When I call your color group you can bring your money and put it in the bucket. Let's see how heavy we can get our bucket!

[Call a Li'l Cowpoke up front to and ask them to show how strong they are by flexing their arm muscles.] Wow! Look at those muscles! I'm sure [child's name] is strong enough to hold our Operation Wheels bucket! [Have Li'l Cowpoke lift the bucket and then set it down.] Wowwee! This bucket sure is heavy! Thank you, Li'l Cowpokes, for loving our friends from far, far away!

[Ring cowbell.] Did you hear that? Remember when you hear the cowbell it means that we are going to do something different.

It's time to circle up, Li'l Cowpokes. Sit in a circle around your Ranch Hand Wrangler. You are going to do an experiment with your friends and your Ranch Hand Wrangler called Color Mountain!

Ranch Hand Wrangler Activity

[Set up supplies ahead of time.] Are you ready to do an experiment? Everyone needs to circle up in his or her group. Ready?



Introduction

Howdy, Li'l Cowpokes! Welcome to Sunset Canyon, the home of our Cactusville Ranch Bible stories. I'm tickled pink to see all of you here today! And I see that you've brought some friends with you! Hot diggity dog! That's terrific!

You're in for a great time learning about our great big God [Stretch your arms wide] and how much He loves you! [Cross your arms and place each hand on its opposite shoulder—the sign for "love" in sign language]

Did you know that God wants you to be His special helper? Yes siree, He sure does! Together, you and God are going do great big things! Did you know that God wants you to get to know His son Jesus, who is calling you to follow Him? It says that right here in the greatest book ever written, the Bible! [Put your hands together, then open them like a book and point to one palm]

Can you open your pretend Bibles with me so we can read what it says? [Pause while you repeat the gesture so the kids can imitate you. Then use an index finger to point to one of your palms as pointing at a verse.]

Here's the verse I was looking for. 2 Timothy 2:9 tells us, "(Jesus) who has saved us and has called us with a holy calling..." [Nod your head] Yep, that's exactly right!

Every day we're here at Sunset Canyon, we'll be meeting a special person from the Bible! These are men and women who were saved and called with a holy calling, just like you! Every day, these special people will show us a way we have been called to follow Jesus. Now let's play a fun game that also shows us how being different is fine and dandy.





Instructions: Match Em!

Gather all the children in one big group. Give every child one Go Fish card, and be sure that at least one child receives a card that doesn't have a match. Show them how to go around the room looking for their match and finally stand beside them when they do. Explain that some children will find matches and some will not, and the ones who don't should come to the center of the room and raise their hand. (Have a Ranch Hand Wrangler stand in the center and wait for them.) Collect all the cards, shuffle them, and repeat the activity until most of the children have had a chance to be "different." Then have the children sit down while you discuss the following questions with them: "Was it hard trying to find your match?" and "How did you feel when you didn't have a match? Did it make you feel different?" Listen carefully and affirm each response.

What to Say: Match 'Em!

Wow! Those were great answers! This little game can help us remember that God calls us to be different from other people. This can mean looking or acting differently than most of the people around us. Let's say our Daily Call together. You ready? [Pause slightly] We are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to be different! Yee-haw!

Today our Bible story is about someone who was asked to look and act very different from most people he knew. Let's find out what God asked him to do!

Story Time

Come sit down. It's time for our story! Sit on our story blankets [Say "mats" or "cushions" instead if that's what you're using] around the campfire. I can hardly wait to introduce you to John the Baptist! He was a very different sort of fellow. He dressed differently, ate differently, and even had a job that was different. He was called to be God's special helper!

[Dramatically put on a biblical costume]


[Use a mysterious whisper and put on a dramatic facial expression as you start your story]

There was once a man who lived in the wilderness next to a river. [Move your hands horizontally like a flowing river] Can you make a river like I'm doing? [Pause so the children can imitate you] His name was John the Baptist. He was...well....different!

John's clothes were different. [Point to your biblical costume] He wore clothes made from camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist! [Show the fur piece and belt and encourage the children to touch them]

John the Baptist's job was different. His family was from the tribe of Levi. Can you say Levi? [Pause while the children say it] And they all lived in the mountains of Judea. Can you say Judea? [Pause while they say it] From the

moment he was born, [Cradle your arms like you are holding a baby] God told John's parents that John would

be His special helper! John was to tell everyone that Jesus was coming. Wow! That's an important job! And that is exactly what he did when he grew up. Once John was all grown up, he said goodbye to his parents [Wave goodbye] and went to live in the wilderness near a river, [Move your hands back and forth horizontally] right where God had told him to go. John would look this way and then that way [Shade your eyes and look left, then right] and whenever he saw someone, he would go over to them and tell them Jesus was coming soon! This was the job that God had called John to do, so he did it!

John the Baptist was a simple man. He wasn't worried about being popular or well-liked by everyone. He always told the truth and tried to do exactly what God wanted him to do! He listened [Cup your ear] to God's call [Point up] to be different.

Not only did John look and dress differently, he even ate food that was different. Matthew 3:4 says that John the Baptist ate locusts, or bugs, and wild honey. Would you eat that? [Pause while the kids answer] Well, he did! [Show honey and grasshoppers]

[As you open the sticks] Just like John the Baptist, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to be different! Yee-haw!

[Give children time to taste the sweet honey] God made the honey to be sweet! Too much honey is not good for you, but a small taste is sweet, yummy, and just right! Mmmm, good!

Guess who John the Baptist's cousin was? Can you guess? [Pause while the children guess] His cousin's name was Jesus! Wowee! Isn't that great? [Clap several times in excitement]

One day Jesus walked down to the river where John was. He went up to His cousin and asked John to baptize Him! That meant Jesus wanted to be lowered down under the water and lifted back up again to show that He was clean. [Demonstrate with your hands, lowering an invisible figure into the water and back up again] Jesus had never done anything wrong and didn't have any sins that needed to be washed away, but He wanted to make an example for us. So John baptized Jesus. [Nod your head] When Jesus came up out of the water, God spoke and told everyone that Jesus was His son,

Before feeding the children honey, check the registration cards for any honey allergies ahead of time and offer an alternative (like reduced sugar maple syrup) to children who have one. Always be affirmative about these differences. For exam-

ple, you could say, "Carolyn

has a beautiful green T-shirt

on today. Oh, it is very nice.

And Brandon has a yellow T-shirt. Oh, very nice indeed!"

[After the game is finished] You are different too! Look around you!
[Point out some features that make the children both similar and different from one another, such as shirt color, eye color, height, gender, etc.] It's fun to have things that are the same as what other people have, but it's also really fun to be different. Just like John the Baptist.

John the Baptist was called to be different, and so are you! People who love Jesus are called Christians. As followers of Christ, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to be different! Yee-haw!

We are different because we are God's helpers! The way we talk and act can help people around us follow Jesus. What are some things you can do that helps others know you love Jesus? [Pause and let the children answer. Affirm each response.]

Wrap Up

[Hand out the magnifying glasses and small objects. If you don't have enough magnifying glasses for each child, have two or three children cluster together and designate when it's time to share it with the next child. Be sure there are enough objects for the children to examine.]

Use your magnifying glass and look at each object. When you look through a magnifying glass, it makes things look bigger and clearer. It helps you see more details. Isn't that cool? Two shells can look pretty much the same when you don't have a magnifying glass, but when we look up close like this, we can see that they are different. [Allow enough time for each child to see one or two items]

This is true for each of us too. While we all have things about us that are the same—we all have noses, [Touch your nose] two eyes, [Point to your eyes] and ten fingers [Wiggle all your fingers]—when you look more carefully, you can tell that each of us are different in special ways. Some of us are tall [Stretch up tall with your arms up] while others are short [Bend your knees and lower body], and some of us have curly hair [Point at





someone in the room with curly hair] while others have straight hair [Point at someone with straight hair]. I'm really glad God made me different! [Point to yourself] Are you glad God made you different? [Nod you head and give the children time to respond] After all, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to be different! Yee-haw!



As we get ready to pray, let's sing this little song.

Song or Poem: I Listen to the Lord

(To the tune of It's Raining, It's Pouring)

I listen [Put your right hand on your right ear]

I listen [Put your left hand on your left ear]

I listen to my Lord [Put both hands on both ears]

I fold my hands [Fold your hands]

And I close my eyes [Close your eyes]

Now I'm ready to talk to Jesus

Dear Jesus, thank you for loving us. Thank you for calling us to be different, just like you did with John the Baptist. We want to be your special helpers just like John the Baptist was. We love you! In Jesus' name we pray, amen.

Now, Li'l Cowpokes, it's time to rustle up and scurry on to your next station! Be sure to stay with your Ranch Hand Wranglers! Thanks for coming to spend time with me today. See you again real soon!

Introduction

[Place the lizard on your shoulder before you speak] Howdy, Li'l Cowpokes! Welcome back to Sunset Canyon! I'm happier than a lizard soaking up the sunshine to have you back again for another story about an unforgettable Bible character. [Give a sudden startled look at your shoulder where the lizard is sitting] Whoa there, Li'l Cowpokes! Where did this lizard come from? I guess he wants to hear today's Bible story too! I wonder which special person from the Bible we get to meet today? Each of them are people who were saved and called with a holy calling, just like you! [Point at the children]

Let's open our pretend Bibles to 2 Timothy 1:9, where it talks about our holy calling. [Put your hands together, then open them like a book and point to one palm] Here it is. I found it! Since this is our God Nugget that you are in the process of learning, let's say it together: "... (Jesus) who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." 2 Timothy 1:9 (NIV). [Say the words slowly and lead out in the hand

motions so the kids can follow]

Nicely done! [Clap your hands]

Instructions: Pack Em Up

Pack 'Em Up

The Ranch Hand Wranglers in each group lead out. Look at each item in your pile—some should be silly—and discuss with the kids which items should be packed and why you need to take them. For example, hold up an object, ask the children what it is and after they tell you, ask if you should pack it. Talk about why you need it, etc. Do this for each item, whether or not it was chosen. Allow 5 minutes for this activity.

What to Say

Pack 'Em Up

Today we are going to pretend that we are about to go on an adventure way over in the land where many of the people from the Bible lived. The first thing we need to do is pack our bags. [Distribute a backpack, suitcase,





or pillowcase to each group's Ranch Hand Wrangler. Each group should also have a pile of 10-12 items to choose from.] Let's choose the items that you think we would need for our trip and put them in our bags.

[After the game is finished] Now that our bags are packed, we can start on our adventure. I hope you're ready for a long ride! Our horses are all saddled up and waiting for us. Let's get on. [Motion for the children to stand up so they can imitate you while you pretend to put one leg up and over a horse's back, and then sit as though you're in a saddle and holding the reins.] If you're ready to ride, let me hear a loud "Yee-haw!" [Cup your hand and listen while the kids shout, "Yee-haw!"] Here we go! [Gallop in place, even circling, while making horse sounds and encouraging the children to do the same. Do this for at least ten seconds.] Whew! [Wipe your brow] That was a long trip. Look where we are now! [Shade your eyes with one hand and look all around] Can you imagine having to pack all your belongings for a really long trip, without having the faintest idea where you are going? That's exactly what happened to the person in today's Bible story. Let's find out what God called him to do!

Story Time

It's time for our story! Come sit down on our story blankets [Say "mats" or "cushions" instead if that's what you're using] around the campfire and get comfortable. I can hardly wait to introduce you to Abraham! He was a very faithful sort of fellow—one of God's very special helpers.

[Dramatically put on your Bible costume. Remind the kids to follow along with your gestures.]

We are at Abraham's house, or I should say tent! Abraham lived in a big tent. [Spread your arms out wide] Today we are going to see what God called Abraham to do! What do you think Abraham looked like? Did he have long hair? [Touch your hair] Did he have a beard? [Dramatically put on the beard] Was he tall? [Point way up] Or was he short? [Bend over and gesture low]

Get nice and cozy-like around the fire and I'll tell you all about it! But I'm going to need your help telling this fine story!

When I say Abraham, I need you to stand up and say, "I'm faithful!"

When I say Sara, make praying hands and say, "I want a son!"

When I say Lot, shade your eyes with one hand and say, "Wow, look at the view!"

[Practice saying this and modeling the motions slowly so the children can do it with you]

I'll help you remember what to do as we go along. Are you ready? [Pause while they respond]

A long, long time ago, Abraham ("I'm faithful!") lived in an area that was flat, like where we are now. He was old and had lots of money. What he wanted more than anything was to have a son, but he was already 75 years and still had no children. (Hold out empty hands and shake your head with a sad face)

But wait! [Hold out your hand in a signal to stop] God told Abraham ("I'm faithful!") to pack up his things and move from the big city where he was living in his nice comfortable tent to a faraway place called Canaan. Even though Abraham didn't know anything about Canaan, he obeyed God and got ready to move. And even though he did not know why he was supposed to go to Canaan, he was willing to go.

So Abraham ("I'm faithful!") packed up his things, took his wife Sara, ("I want a son!") his nephew Lot, ("Wow, Look at the view!") and a few other friends and relatives, and hit the dusty trail! He had no idea that the place he was going to would change his life forever. [Hold your hand over your mouth in surprise] You see,





when God called Abraham, ("I'm faithful!") God made him a promise that someday he would be the father of a great nation. Abraham ("I'm faithful!") was answering God's call to be faithful! And just like Abraham, ("I'm faithful!") we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to be faithful! Yee-haw!

[Hold out a Bible opened to Hebrews 11:8] Listen to what the Bible says about Abraham ("I'm faithful!") in the book of Hebrews. "By faith Abraham ("I'm faithful!") obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going" (Hebrews 11:8). Imagine leaving where you had grown up your whole life with all of your family and friends to follow God. Imagine leaving behind most of the things you owned and just packing one or two suitcases before starting on a long trip to a place you'd never heard of before! Wowsers!



The Bandana Shuffle

Choose two Li'l Cowpokes from your group. Tie a bandana around one Li'l Cowpoke's right ankle and around the other Li'l Cowpoke's left ankle. Place a Bible five to ten feet in front of them and instruct them to work together to reach it and bring it back to you. Do this several times with different Li'l Cowpoke partners.

Got the Point!

The Bandana Shuffle

Li'l Cowpokes, we are going to take a break from our long journey and play a little game. [After the game is finished] Wow! You Li'l Cowpokes did a great job of working together!

Sometimes it takes team work to get a job done. In today's story, Abraham had to learn to work together with God and trust God to lead him and his family to a new and safe place to pitch their tents! When you have faith and trust in God, you'll never be afraid

of what lies ahead and you will be ready for whatever God calls you to do.

Now, back to our story! Remember to help me out by imitating the gestures I make! A lot happened during the big move and it wasn't all fun and games, that's for sure! There was a time when there was not enough food! Sara ("I want a son!") was almost taken from Abraham, ("I'm faithful!") and there was war. But after many years had passed, God kept his promise. When Abraham ("I'm

invisible baby in your arms and rock it back and forth] and they named him Isaac. Sara ("I want a son!") was 90 years old. Oh my! What rejoicing and

faithful!") was 100 years old, Sara ("I want a son!") had a baby [Cradle an

great celebration there was! [Clap your hands with joy] Abraham ("I'm faithful!") and Sara ("I want a son!") answered God's call to be faithful. Yee-haw!







Just like Abraham ("I'm faithful!") and Sara ("I want a son!") in our Bible story today, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to be faithful! Yee-haw!

Can you think of ways you can be faithful? [Pause and see if any children raise their hands. Listen to their answers and affirm them.] See if you can guess what I am doing now. [Go through motions of making your bed. Give clues if they don't guess correctly.] That's right. I can be faithful by making my bed every day. See if you can guess what I'm doing now. [Go through the motions of setting the table for supper—silverware, napkins, plates, etc. Give clues if they don't guess correctly.] You guessed it! I'm helping set the table for supper. That's another way I can be faithful to God's calling. You can practice being faithful by obeying your mommy or daddy when they ask you to do things like picking up your toys, brushing your teeth, or taking out the trash. You can listen and obey and faithfully do just what they asked you to.

That's exactly what Abraham ("I'm faithful!") did. He obeyed when God asked him to pack up and move to a new place. He was faithful to follow God's calling even though he didn't know where he was going to live. How many of you would like to ask God to help you be faithful to Him? [Raise your hand and wait while the children raise theirs]



As we get ready to pray, let's sing this little song.

Introduction

Howdy Li'l Cowpokes! Welcome back to Sunset Canyon, our campfire story station. We've had two great days at Cactusville Ranch already, isn't that right? [Nod your head and pause to allow them to respond] And I think today is going to be totally terrific! Let me hear you say a big yee-haw if you agree with me! [Pause and cup one hand to your ear while the children shout, "Yee-haw!"] I wonder which special person from the Bible we get to meet today? Each of them are people who were saved and called with a holy calling, just like you! [Point at the children]

Let's open our pretend Bibles to 2 Timothy 1:9, where it talks about our holy calling. [Put your hands together, then open them like a book and point to one palm] Here it is. I found it! As you probably know, this is our Gold

Nugget. I'm guessing that some of you know it by heart by now. Let's say it together. "...(Jesus) who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." (2 Timothy 1:9). [Say the words slowly and lead out in the hand motions so the kids can follow along]



Nicely done! [Clap your hands]



Faces and Feelings

[For this activity, download the pictures of faces showing different emotions from AdventistVBX.com for free]

Can you guys show me a happy face? [Smile and show a picture of a happy face] Can you show me a sad face? [Frown and show a picture of the sad face] What about an angry face? [Scowl and say, "Grrrr," and show a picture of an angry face] Wow! You guys really know how to use your faces to show your emotions! [Clap several times] Nice job!

Have your parents ever done something super special for you that was a big surprise? Maybe they gave you a special gift that you weren't expecting, or took you on a special trip to your favorite water park without





telling you ahead of time? What did your parents do to surprise you? [Pause, allow time for responses, and affirm their answers]

Show me the expression on your face when you opened that special gift and discovered exactly what you had been wanting for so long. [Pause and let the children make surprised looks. Affirm their efforts.] Now, what about going to your favorite water park? Show me what your face would look like if you realized you were finally being taken to the water park you like so much! [Pause and let the children make surprised and/or excited looks. Affirm their efforts.]

What if a friend did something mean to you that really hurt your feelings, and they didn't even say they were sorry? Would you be able to forgive that friend for what they did to you? Today we're going to hear a story about someone who had many mean things done to him, but God called him to forgive anyway.

Story Time

It's time for our story! Come sit down on our story blankets [Say "mats" or "cushions" instead if that's what you're using] around the campfire and get comfortable. I've been keeping the fire nice and hot until you got here. [Rub your hands over the pretend campfire] Before we start today's story, let's see how good your memories are. If you think you know the answer to my question, raise your hand and I will call on one of you. On our first day at Sunset Canyon, we talked about a man who God called to be different. Can anyone tell me his name? [Pause and look for raised hands. Select one, listen to the answer, and affirm it. If the first answer is incorrect, call on someone else.] Very good! You are exactly right, it was John the Baptist. Are you ready for the next question? [Pause and wait for the children to answer] Here it is. Yesterday our story told us about someone God called to be faithful. Does anyone remember who that was? [Pause, raise your hand, and look for the children's raised hands. Select one, listen to the answer, and affirm it. If the first answer is incorrect, call on someone else.] That's right, yesterday's story was about Abraham. Nice job! You guys have great memories!

I can hardly wait to introduce you to our Bible story character for today! I think you're really going to like him. Today's story is all about how God called a boy named Joseph to be His special helper. Joseph's life was full of adventures—some that made him happy, some that made him sad, and some that even made him feel kind of mad! But through it all, God called Joseph to forgive. Just as we are called!

Kids: Called to forgive! Yee-haw!

Li'l Cowpokes, we can watch and listen to our story today! Let's see what happens with Joseph and his brothers. (Read the story out of My Bible Friends, Book 1, Story 4: Joseph and His Brothers or stream the Vimeo link at https://vimeo.com/28529552.)

This is only one option for today's story. You can also use the story script given below.

[Dramatically put on your Bible costume]

Our story starts with a boy named Joseph and his family! Joseph's parents really loved him. His father wanted to give Joseph something extra special to show him how much he was loved. Can you guess what it was? I'll give you some clues: It was warm and it had many colors! Any guesses? Raise your hand if you think you know. [Scan the group looking for raised hands. Call on someone and affirm their answer.] That's right, it was a beautiful coat. It may have looked like this. [Hold up a colorful robe or piece of fabric. Have the kids touch it, may-





be try it on.] If you were Joseph, would you have liked it? [Pause while the children respond] Well Joseph liked it a lot, but he had eleven other brothers who did not get a coat like this one! They were grumpy and jealous. Would you have been grumpy if you were his brothers? [Pause while they respond]

Li'l Cowpokes, I need your help while I'm telling this story.

When you hear the word coat, put your arms around your shoulders and give yourself a hug.

When you hear the word jealous, make your most jealous face.

When you hear the word *prison*, put your wrists together.

When you hear the word food, rub your tummy and say, "Mmm, mmm!"

When you hear the words forgive or forgave, say, "Yee-haw!" and shake someone's hand.

When you hear the words oh no, put both hands on your cheeks and shake your head no.

I'll help you remember what to do as we go along. Are you ready? [Pause while the children respond]

When Joseph was twelve years old, his dad gave him a beautiful, colorful coat (hug). The other brothers were very jealous (jealous face). It wasn't a pretty sight. When we feel jealous (jealous face), it doesn't make us happy at all. [Shake your head no and frown] To make things worse, Joseph started to have dreams about himself and his brothers with him standing in the center and his brothers bowing down all around him. Joseph didn't know what these dreams meant, but he made the mistake of telling his brothers about them.

This made Joseph's brothers jealous (jealous face) and very angry, [Make an angry face and say, "Grrr"] so they decided to do a really mean thing to Joseph. They sold him, their own brother, to a group of strangers on camels that was passing by on their way to Egypt. Can you imagine your brother or sister selling you to a total stranger? Oh no! (shake head). That would be awful!

A long time went by while Joseph was away from his family, but God watched over him and took care of him the whole time. One of the adventures Joseph had was going to prison (wrists together) for something that he didn't even do.

After a long time in prison (wrists together), Joseph was called to tell the Egyptian king, Pharaoh, what the dreams he had been having meant—something no one else had been able to do. With God's help, Joseph was able to tell Pharaoh the meaning of these dreams: seven years of rain and good harvests would be coming soon and the people of Egypt would be able to grow as much food as they wanted! Then, seven years of famine would come after that, and all the rain would stop and no one would be able to grow anything at all. Oh no! (shake head) The Pharaoh was so impressed that he made Joseph his second in command over all of Egypt!

Joseph had a big job to do now. God gave Joseph instructions to grow as much food ("Mmm, mmm!") as he could during the first seven years and store it all up, so that when the seven bad years came after that everyone would have enough to eat. Sure enough, thanks to all of Joseph's hard work, even after the rain stopped and nothing would grow, nobody in Egypt went hungry! Soon the news spread to even the faraway countries that there was plenty to eat in Egypt, so people from all over traveled there to buy food ("Mmm, mmm!").

Joseph was now a very important man in Egypt and it was his job to make sure all the people had enough to eat. To his surprise, one day his older brothers came all the way to Egypt to buy food ("Mmm, mmm!")! His older brothers! Joseph could have felt very angry about this [Make a mad face]. He could have been mean





back to them to get even. But Joseph didn't. Instead, he decided to test them to see if they were still mean people or if they had changed over the years. After they paid for their food ("Mmm, mmm!"), Joseph had his servants put his brothers' money back into their food bags ("Mmm, mmm!"). Joseph also tested them by putting his special silver cup in Benjamin's, his youngest brother's, bag.

Got the Point!

Cup, Cup, Who's Got the Cup?

We're going to play a little game that goes along with the tests Joseph gave his brothers. I need everyone to come sit in a circle. [Pause while kids come over and sit down] I'm going to hand two of you a small marble. [Do so while continuing to talk] Keep the marbles hidden in your hands so they can't be seen. I also need one Ranch Hand Wrangler to volunteer to be my steward. [Pause and select one Ranch Hand Wrangler] Li'l Cowpokes, you are going to pass the marbles around the circle. Try not to drop them and or let anyone see them as they pass from person to person. While you are passing the marbles, each of you should pretend like you're holding a marble at all times, even if you have nothing in your hands! [Mime how to secretively pass a marble to the next person]

Meanwhile, our steward is going to walk around the outside of the circle and try to see who is holding the silver cup (our marbles). While walking, the steward will say, "Cup, cup, who's got the cup? My best guess is the cup is here!" [Say the words slowly and rhythmically. Put a great emphasis on the word "here."] On the word "here," the steward will stop behind one player and tap them on the shoulder. That player must then open both hands and show if the cup—or one of the marbles—is in them. If he or she is caught holding the cup, that player must stand, put both hands together as if they're praying, bow slightly, and say "I'm so sorry." The other children in the circle will then respond by saying, "We forgive you!"

If the player's hands are empty, everyone goes back to passing the marbles around and the steward will continue to walk around the circle. [Repeat this sequence at least five or six times. To keep the game exciting, the steward should alternate between choosing a child that is obviously holding a marble and one whose hands are empty.]

[After the game is over] Now you can go sit on your cushions again. Relax and get comfy while we finish the story of Joseph. And remember to help me when you hear the special words in the story!

The brothers were on their way home with their bags of food ("Mmm, mmm!") when soldiers from Egypt caught up with them and made them come back. They were brought in before Joseph, where he accused the brothers of being thieves and told them their youngest brother, Benjamin, would be punished because of what they had done. Oh no! (shake head)

The other brothers begged Joseph, "Please, please, please, let Benjamin go!" They even asked Joseph to punish them instead of Benjamin. With tears in his eyes [Wipe pretend tears from your eyes], Joseph saw the change in the hearts of his brothers. They were not mean anymore. Can you guess what Joseph did next? [Pause, nod your head, and wait for the kids to respond] He forgave them! ("Yee-haw!") Isn't that wonderful?





Joseph accepted God's call to forgive. ("Yee-haw!") He opened his arms [Open your arms wide] and told them, "I am your brother Joseph. I forgive you!" ("Yee-haw!")



Li'l Cowpokes, let's see what the Bible has to say about forgiveness. [Hold out a Bible opened to Matthew 6:14. Point to the verse so the children can see] Right here in Matthew 6:14, God says, "For if you forgive ['Yee-haw!' Shake someone's hand] men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive ['Yee-haw!' Shake someone's hand] you."

So you see, Joseph wasn't the only person that God called to forgive. The Bible tells us that we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to forgive! Yee-haw!

Sometimes bad things may happen to us that don't seem fair. Maybe there' someone you know who is mean to you, but God can help us forgive them just like He helped Joseph. God is always right there with you no matter what happens. And even though it's a hard thing to do, God wants us to forgive the people that are mean to us. The good news is God will help us do this hard thing and even make us want to forgive others! Isn't that terrific?

Can you think of someone that you need to forgive? You can ask God to help you. Let's do that right now.



As we get ready to pray, let's sing this little song.

Introduction

Welcome back, Li'l Cowpokes! I see you've returned to Sunset Canyon for another campfire story. I'm glad you're here! Are you enjoying yourselves at Cactusville Ranch? [Pause, nod your head, and allow the children to answer] Are you having fun? [Pause, nod your head, give a thumbs up, and allow the children to answer] What have you enjoyed doing the most here at the Ranch? [Pause, allow for several responses. Affirm each answer, such as by saying "Yeah, me too!" or "I agree, that was fun!" etc.]

I wonder which special person from the Bible we get to meet today! Each of them are people who were saved and called with a holy calling, just like you! [Point at the children]

Let's open our pretend Bibles to 2 Timothy 1:9, our Gold Nugget, where it talks about our holy calling. [Put your hands together, then open them like a book and point to one palm] Here it is. I found it! I'm guessing that quite a

few of you know our Gold Nugget by heart now. Let's practice saying it together. "...(Jesus) who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." (2 Timothy 1:9). [Say the words slowly and lead out in the hand motions so the kids can follow along]

Great job! [Clap your hands]



"I can , can vou?"

I know that God made me with special things I can do! This little game lets us show each other some of the special things that all of us can do. It is called, "I can_____, you?" All you need to do is say those four words and add something special in the middle that you can do and want to show us. When you're done, we will all try to do it too.

Watch me; I'll go first. "I can wink, can you?" [Wink and pause so the children can copy you. Some will be able to, others won't. Affirm everyone for trying. Other examples you can use include: "I can curl my tongue, can you?" and "I can touch my toes, can you?" and "I can whisper, can you?" Give as many examples as you feel the children need to grasp the game, then choose a child to go next. Encourage everyone to take a turn and help the children who can't think of anything by giving them a suggestion. Affirm the other children for attempting whatever the task is, and make the observation that there are things that some people can do and some can't. You can say something like, "Wow, you can do something not everyone can! That's a special talent that God gave you!"]





[When all the children have had a chance to play] Boy, howdy! You Li'l Cowpokes can sure do a lot of unique things! Did God make us so we could all do the same things? [Pause, shake your head, slowly, and give them time to answer] Why not? [Pause to see if they can come up with any answers. Affirm any answers they give] I think it is because God made each of us special and gave each of us special talents or abilities. Can you use the special talents God gave you to serve others and make them happy? [Pause, nod your head, and allow them to answer] I think that's exactly what God wants you to do.

Our campfire is ready and waiting for us. Are you ready to hear a really good story? [Pause, clap your hands in excitement, and allow them time to respond] We are going to learn about a very special lady. Her name is Deborah. God called her to serve others in some very interesting ways! Let's get ready to meet her!

Story Time

[You will be role-playing today's story, so select children from the group to play the following roles: Deborah, Barak, Jabin, and Jabin's army (2-3 kids). Give each of them Bible costumes to wear (optional).]

Come sit down on our story blankets [Say "mats" or "cushions" instead if that's what you're using] around the campfire and get cozy and comfortable. Oh, I can hardly wait to introduce you to Deborah! She was an amazing lady who was very wise and very kind! Best of all, she was one of God's special helpers!

[Dramatically put on a Bible costume]

There was once a lady who had lots of jobs to do. Her name was Deborah! [Call up the child who is dressed as Deborah and have her stand in front of the group] She lived a long time ago in a land called Israel, where there was no king or queen or president to rule her country. God was Israel's King. And just like Deborah, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for the kids to respond]

Kids: Called to serve! Yee-haw!

Deborah said yes to God's call! She sat under a big palm tree near the city gate and served as a judge for God. [Instruct "Deborah" to sit down] That means she helped people solve their problems when they had arguments or disagreements with each other. That's a real talent! [Nod your head] God called Deborah to do another job too! She often studied God's Word [Hand "Deborah" a Bible] and she learned to listen for God's messages. After she heard a message from God and was told who it should go to, Deborah would go give that person God's special message. That job is called being a prophetess. Can you say that with me? [Pause and say "prophetess" slowly so the children can say it with you] Nice job! God called Deborah to serve

as a prophetess, just like we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for the kids to respond]

Kids: Called to serve! Yee-haw!

Wow! I'd like to hear special messages from God too! [Pat your chest and nod your head in agreement] One day, God used Deborah to give a really important message! [Have "Deborah" stand up in front again] You see, there was a king named Jabin [Have the child dressed as Jabin stand in front of the children] that was not very nice. And he had a great big army! [Have the three children dressed as Jabin's army stand beside the king] All the people were afraid of the king's army. No one knew what to do. [Widen your eyes and put one hand over your mouth. Encourage the children to copy your expression and gesture.] Oh no!





So Deborah talked to God [Fold your hands as if in prayer] and God told her exactly what to do. She called for a man named Barak [Have the child dressed as Barak stand beside Deborah], a leader in Israel's army, to come hear God's message. Let's read the message in the Bible that Deborah told her friend Barak. It is found in Judges 4:6, 7. [Bend over and hold the Bible in front of "Deborah" and "Barak" while pointing to the verse] "The Lord, the God of Israel's people commands you to take ten thousand men from the tribes and go fight Sisera, the leader of Jabin's army. I will make him go to the Kishon River. He will go with his chariots and his army. I will give you success."

Wow! That was a brave thing that God was asking Barak to do! [Bend over so you're down at your Li'l Cowpokes' level and lower your voice to a whisper while you ask the next question] Have you ever been afraid to do something you were told to do? [Widen your eyes and nod your head yes] I have! When Barak heard God's message, he was afraid too! He told Deborah he couldn't go fight the army by himself [Hug yourself and shiver], but if she would go with him, he would do it. What! Can you believe that? But just like we are called... [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for the kids to respond]

Kids: Called to serve! Yee-haw!

...Deborah was called to serve too, so she went with Barak. They put together a small army [Cup your hands together as if to show something small] and went up to fight Jabin's huge army [Spread your arms wide apart]. They did exactly what God said to do, and they won the battle!

Everyone in Israel was mighty happy that Barak and Deborah had won the battle! [Clap your hands] Hurray! Deborah and Barak knew who they needed to thank. Can you guess who that was? [Pause and allow the children time to answer] Yes, it was Jesus! Hurray for Jesus! Hurray for Jesus! [Encourage the children to cheer with you and clap. Thank the children for their roles in the play and ask them to sit down again by the fire. Your helpers can help them take their Bible costumes off.]



Create a Song Activity

Give each child a set of music sticks. Say, not sing, the words first and have everyone tap their sticks in time (four taps per line). Practice Judges 5:12 line by line, saying the words and tapping the sticks. Practice a line 3-4 times before going on to the next line. Once the children have learned the words, you can try adding the tune of Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star to it and singing the song. If it works better just to speak it while tapping the sticks, don't worry about singing it just yet.

Have the Ranch Hand Wranglers collect the sticks. Now using a guitar, ukulele, or other instrument, you can lead the children in singing the words of the song to the melody of "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star." Repeat it several times. As a finishing touch, you can make up hand motions to go along with the words.





Got the Point!

You know, Deborah served God with all her talents. Not only was she a judge and a prophetess, the Bible also tells us she was a poet and a songwriter! After the battle against Jabin's army, Deborah and Barak wrote a song about being called by God! Do you want to hear part of that song? [Read Judges 5:12] I wish we knew what that song sounded like. I bet it became one of the people's favorite songs after the battle was over! I think we can come up with a tune so we can sing her song too! Let's try!

Song: Judges 5:12

(To the tune of Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star)

Wake up, wake up, Deborah!

Wake up, wake up, sing a song!

Arise, Barak! God is calling!

Arise, Barak! God is calling!

Wake up, wake up, Deborah!

Wake up, wake up, God is calling!

Wow! We just made up a song! I wonder if it was anything like Deborah's song? You know, writing songs and being a prophet are neat ways to serve God. It makes God happy when you use your talents to serve others. After all, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for the kids to respond]

Kids: Called to serve! Yee-haw!



Li'l Cowpokes, let's see what the Bible has to say about serving others. [Hold out a Bible open to I Peter 4:10. Point to the verse so the children can see.] Right here in I Peter 4:10 it says, "Each one should use whatever gifts he has to serve others." So you see, God is asking each one of us to obey His calling to serve others. That's why He gave each of us different abilities, unique talents, and special gifts.

One of the ways I answered God's call was by telling you today's Bible story! You can answer God's call and serve others by singing or repeating a verse from the Bible! Can you think of other ways you can serve others? [Affirm each answer with a positive comment such as "Yes, that's a good way!"]

Those were great ideas of how you can serve others! You can also ask God to show you other ways to serve that maybe you haven't even thought of yet. Let's do that right now.

- Bible
- Picture of Jesus taped to the wall at Li'l Cowpoke eye level
- · Small pieces of tape to attach hearts to the Jesus picture

Introduction

Howdy, Li'I Cowpokes! It's good to see you again. Can you believe this is our last day at the Ranch? This week has gone by so quickly! I'm so glad you came to see me at Sunset Canyon for our final campfire story. We have had four great stories so far this week. Can you tell me who our story was about on the first day? Raise your hand if you know the answer. [Pause, look for raised hands, and select a child to answer. Affirm the answer even if it's wrong. Call on more raised hands until you get the right answer.] Yes, you're right! Our first story was about John the Baptist. Can you tell me who the story was about on the second day? [Pause, look for raised hands, and select a child to answer as before] Great job! That's correct. Our second story was about Abraham. How about the story on the third day? Who was God's special helper then? [Pause, look for raised hands, and select a child to answer] Wow! You guys have great memories. You're exactly right. The story on the third day was about Joseph. Now for the easiest question of all. Who was our story about yesterday? [Pause, look for raised hands, and select a child to answer] Right again! It was about Deborah. You Li'l Cowpokes did a terrific job of remembering all the people from the Bible we've had stories about this week. Each of them were men and women who were saved and called with a holy calling, just like you! [Point at the children]

I wonder which of God's special helpers from the Bible we get to meet today? [Bend forward and speak in a whisper] I heard that today's story is about a very, very special person. You won't want to miss a word of this story!

All week long we've been working on learning our Gold Nugget. I bet that a bunch of you know this verse by heart now. Let's open our pretend Bibles to 2 Timothy 1:9, where it talks about our holy calling. [Put your hands together, then open them like a book and point to one palm] Did you find the verse? As we say it together, I'm going to talk softly so I can hear all of you say our Gold Nugget loud and clear. Ready? [Pause slightly]

Here we go! "...(Jesus) who has saved us and called us with a holy calling..." (2 Timothy 1:9). [Say the words slowly and lead out in the hand motions]

Wow! That sounded great! Good job, everyone! [Clap your hands]

Let's Imagine!

We're going to play a little game that uses your imagination! That sounds exciting, doesn't it? Your imagination is right up here in your thinking place. [Tap your temples with your pointer fingers] Can you say this and tap your temples with me? "This is my imagination place!" [Kids repeat after you and tap their temples]

I want you to help me imagine the most perfect place in all the world! That place is heaven. Close your eyes and put your hands over them. Using your imagination, what do you see? I will go first. I see a beautiful tree with different kinds of fruit on each branch. What about you? When you feel me give you a little tap on your shoulder, it will be your turn to say something you imagine is in heaven. [Slowly walk around the outside of the circle and gently tap each Li'l Cowpoke on the shoulder one by one] and say, "What does [insert Li'l Cowpoke's name] see?" [Most kids will have answers such as "sunshine," "animals," "God," or "streets of gold." If they have trouble thinking of something, you can assist them by asking questions or giving hints.]

Heaven is so amazing! And the exciting news is that heaven will be even better than the very best things we can imagine! We will have to see it for ourselves to fully understand how totally amazing it is! That gives us something to look forward to, doesn't it? [Pause, nod your head yes, and wait while the children respond]

Our campfire is ready and waiting for us. Are you ready to hear the best story ever? [Pause, clap your hands in excitement, and allow them time to respond] We are going to learn about a very special person. He is God's son, Jesus, who God called to give to others in an unforgettable way. Let's get ready to meet Him!

Story Time

Come sit down on our story blankets [Say "mats" or "cushions" instead if that's what you're using] around the campfire and get cozy and comfortable. Oh, I can hardly wait to introduce you to Jesus! He is the most amazing Person who ever lived. Not only was Jesus one of God's special helpers, He was also God's only Son.

[Dramatically put on a Bible costume]

Our story is all about Jesus and how much He loves us! Today we are going to see how God called Jesus to be His helper. Just like we are called... [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to give! Yee-haw!

...Jesus was also called to give. Today's special Helper not only lived here on earth, but was also one of the three most important Beings in all of Heaven. [Hold up three fingers one at a time] Can anybody tell me the names of any of these three important Beings? Raise your hand if you think you know any of Their names. [Pause and look for raised hands. Call on children until you get all three answers. If you don't, give the answers yourself.] Yes, that's right! The names of the three most important Beings in heaven are God the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.





God created a perfect world full of beautiful trees and flowers, birds and fish, and all kinds of animals. After He finished creating all those things, He created a man and a woman whose names were Adam and Eve. God loved Adam and Eve very much and every day He would come to the beautiful garden where they lived to walk and talk with them. Adam and Eve loved God too and looked forward to spending time with Him each day. Just like God had a heart full of love for Adam and Eve, He also really, really loves you and me! [Wrap your arms around your shoulders and give yourself a hug]

What to Say

Activity Part 1 — **Hearts to Share**

I have a little job for you to do. There are small, laminated paper hearts lying all around this campfire story area and we are going to take a few minutes to see if we can find all of them. If you find two hearts, keep one for yourself and share the other one with someone who doesn't have a heart yet. We want everyone to end up with one heart. Ready? Let's go and look. [When the time is up, ask the children to sit back down on their campfire story blanket and hold on to their paper hearts. Make sure that each child is holding a heart.]

Our story has a sad part. Can you show me your saddest face? [Pause while children make sad faces] Oh, yeah! Those are very sad faces! You see, this is what happened. Soon after God the Father and Jesus created the perfect world, it got really messed up because the two people He created decided not to obey what God had asked them to do. [Place a hand on each cheek and encourage the children to do the same. Invite them to say "oh no" with you.] Oh no! When Adam and Eve chose not to listen and obey God, but instead did what they wanted to do—that's called sin! [Shake your head no very sadly] Uh-oh! By doing this, what Adam and Eve were really saying was, "We know more than you, God. We can be our own bosses. We don't need You to tell us what to do!"

Do you want to know what happened after that? Things got really messed up. People stopped listening to what God was telling them. They started doing and saying whatever they wanted to, even if it was exactly what God had said not to do! Oh dear! [Place a hand on each cheek] After being their own bosses for a while, people stopped loving God or wanting to follow Jesus. Oh my! [Shake your head sadly] As more time passed, it became really hard to find any good people that still loved Jesus! People began to fight and hurt each other. That's what sin does to people. When they stopped loving God, their hearts became filled with ugly sin! That was not good! [Shake your head from side to side]

What to Say

Activity Part 2 — All Marked Up

[Pass out a dry-erase crayon or marker to each child. Have them make big stripes on their hearts with different colors.]

The marks you made on your hearts are to remind us of the mean and hurtful things that people did to each other and to the beautiful world God and Jesus had made for them. But you know what? God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit had a plan! [Clap your hands several times with joy] They knew how to get people to follow Jesus again and how to make their hearts clean again! Yep, they sure did! This was their plan. Listen carefully! [Lean forward and whisper] It was decided that Jesus would leave heaven, the most awesome place you could imagine, and He would come down to this earth. Jesus would make Himself into a little human baby [Cradle





an invisible baby in your arms and rock it side to side] that would be born to a human mother here on this earth. He would grow up into a big and tall man. [Stretch your arm up as tall as you can] And He would walk around and talk to as many people on earth as He could. He showed great love for every person He met, no matter if they were young or old, rich or poor, mean or nice. He told everyone [Stretch your arms out wide] how much God loved them, and through the kind things that He did, Jesus showed people how letting their hearts love and trust God again was the only way to be happy. Wowee! What a great plan! [Clap several times with joy]



Got the Point!

Activity Part 3 — Wiped Clean

[Use a damp paper towel to clean off your laminated heart. While you continue to talk, have your Ranch Hand Wranglers give each Li'l Cowpoke a piece of damp paper towel.]

Look at my heart now! When I love and trust God again, it makes everything so much better! Now that all the ugly sin is gone from my heart and it's all clean again, it makes it much easier for me to love and trust God and be ready to answer His call to give. Because just like Jesus, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to give! Yee-haw!

Now it's your turn to wipe all the ugly sin off your hearts. [Give them time to wipe their laminated hearts clean. The Ranch Hand Wranglers can assist any children who need help and then collect the used paper towel pieces and throw them away.] Remember, Jesus is the only One who can take away the sin from our hearts. It's not something we can do for ourselves. We are wiping our hearts clean today to remind us of what Jesus can do for each one of us.

Jesus knows we need to stay close to Him so He can help our hearts stay clean. He tells us we will be happiest when we let Him be the Boss of our lives! After all, Jesus created us so He knows what is best for us. Another piece of good news is that as part of His special plan, Jesus is preparing a place for us in Heaven so we **can live forever with Him. Isn't that exciting? Hurray!** [Clap your hands and encourage the children to mimic you]



💨 Wrap Up

You might be wondering what you need to do in order to be ready to live with Jesus forever. Well, guess what? Jesus has already done all the hard work for you. [Smile and nod your head] You just need to listen and obey when God speaks to you. One way He does that is through the words written in the Bible. That is God's special love letter to you! Let's see what the Bible has to say about loving others. [Hold out your Bible opened to Ephesians 5:2. Point to the verse so the children can see] Right here in Ephesians 5:2, it says, "Walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us." So you see, God is asking each one of us to obey His call to love others and be willing to spend time doing nice things for other people. As we've learned today, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to give! Yee-haw!

When we do nice things for members of our families, our friends, the people who live on our street, or the people we see at church, we are answering God's call to give.





Jesus showed His love for us when He came and lived on this earth so He could tell everyone how much God loves them too and wants them to come live with Him forever. Jesus loves you very much and will always love you. Isn't that nice to know? There's nothing you can do or say that will make Jesus stop loving you. No matter who you are, how you look, what language you speak, or where you live, He loves you! Let's hold up our clean hearts and say, "Thank you Jesus!" Let's say it together. Ready? [Pause, lift up your paper heart, and lead the children in saying, "Thank you Jesus!"] The Bible tells how Jesus made it possible for us to keep our hearts clean. That was Jesus' gift to every one of us! All we have to do is tell God we are sorry when we do or say something not nice and He will forgive us. The instant we are forgiven, our hearts are wiped clean again, just like when we wiped all the marks off our paper hearts.

When we ask Jesus to be the Boss of our lives, and tell Him we want to listen and obey the messages He gives us in the Bible, it's called giving our hearts to Jesus. Let's show Jesus how much we love Him by bringing up our paper hearts and taping them near the picture of Jesus.

[Ask the Ranch Hand Wranglers to help each child put a piece of tape on the back of their hearts and show them how to stick their hearts on the wall next to the picture of Jesus. Allow enough time for each child to go up and put a heart on the wall.]

Let's pray and thank God that He gave us Jesus so we could get to know and love Him better, and that we can give our hearts to Him and let Him be the Boss of our lives.



As we get ready to pray, let's sing this little song.

Song or Poem: I Listen to the Lord

(To the tune of It's Raining, It's Pouring)

I listen [*Put your right hand on your right ear*]

I listen [Put your left hand on your left ear]

I listen to my Lord [Put both hands on both ears]

I fold my hands [Fold your hands]

And I close my eyes [Close your eyes]

Now I'm ready to talk to Jesus

Dear Jesus, we love you very much and want to give You our hearts. Thank you for taking the ugly sin out of our hearts and making them all clean again. We want You to be the Boss of our lives and we want to show other people Your love too. Thank You for giving so much to us. Help us to always be ready to answer Your call to give. We ask all these things in Jesus' name. Amen!

Well Li'l Cowpokes, thanks for stopping by Sunset Canyon for another campfire story. We have heard stories about some real heroes of the Bible this week! I hope that you will remember these stories and remember that we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]

Kids: Called to give! Yee-haw!

Now it's time to hit the dusty trail to your next station! Be sure to stay with your Ranch Hand Wranglers. Enjoy your last day at Cactusville Ranch, and I hope to see you again next year!











The Wild Horse Corral at Cactusville Ranch is designed to give children unstructured exploration time at several sensory stations in addition to participation in one teacher-led group activity. The sensory stations allow the Li'l Cowpokes to have some free time where they can choose the activity/activities that appeal to them. They can spend the entire unstructured exploration time at one sensory station or they can move freely from one activity to the next. The group activity will tie into the Daily Call or that day's Bible story character, while the sensory stations provide tactile experiences more in keeping with the Cactusville Ranch setting—a ranch with animals located near a mining town in the Southwest desert.

Keep three points in mind as you set up your Wild Horse Corral sensory stations:

- 1. **Keep it simple.** Use the axiom "less is more" as your rule of thumb. Many of the supplies that you will need for the sensory stations are probably things you already have on hand.
- 2. **Everyone can help!** Keep your preschool team (Station Leaders and Ranch Hand Wranglers) nearby to help facilitate at the sensory stations if needed.
- 3. Plan to lead out in your group activity first. The teacher-led activity allows the children to practice their listening skills and to play together for several minutes. Be sure to cover the sensory stations during this time so the children aren't distracted by the sight of the appealing activities that will soon follow. The best course of action is to cover all the sensory stations before your Li'l Cowpokes arrive each day. Start with the group activity and only uncover them when you're ready for free time. When it's time for each group of children to leave, cover the sensory stations again before the next group arrives.

We have included more sensory stations than you will need. Look them over and select the ones which are the best fit for your children's personalities and your available space.

Examples of Popular Sensory Stations

Your Li'l Cowpokes are attracted to things that they can touch, feel, squish, and pour! Here are some suggestions for sensory stations you can add to your Wild Horse Corral.

1. **Rice bin:** Purchase a half-size under-the-bed box from Walmart. Fill it with 5 lb. or more of rice. Provide plastic farm animals, plastic domestic animals, a barn, fences, and trees. Li'l Cowpokes will have fun digging roads, arranging the animals, and building their own Cactusville Ranch!

2. Water trough: Water play is always a favorite activity! It usually takes minimal accessories and supplies and can be set up (and cleaned up!) in just minutes. Purchase a half-size under-the-bed box from Walmart. Fill the container with water and add plastic shapes that float well, such as ice cube star shapes, plastic fish, and boats, as well as shapes that do not float, such as shells. Also provide plastic tongs, hand colanders, and sorting cups.





- 3. **Water pouring:** Another water play station! The inclusion of two different water play areas is always a big hit! Purchase an under-the-bed box from Walmart. Place plastic pitchers of various sizes (filled up about ¾ of the way) and a variety of different sized plastic containers in the large box. For added enjoyment, add food coloring to the pitchers of water and watch your Li'l Cowpokes mix and match as they pour water from one container to another! Keep a large pitcher full of water handy to refill the smaller pitchers. As soon as it is empty, fill up the large pitcher again so extra water is always available.
- 4. **Magnetic letters and shapes:** Take a large oil pan (25" x 47", available for purchase at Walmart) and lean it against or mount it to the wall. Add magnetic letters and shapes. A favorite is the TOMY Gearation Fridge Magnet Set available at Walmart. You may need to purchase several sets of magnets and oil pans if you have a large group of preschoolers.
- 5. **Jumbo blocks:** Colorful blocks with an interlocking design allow your Li'l Cowpokes to create unlimited designs and possibilities. In addition to having loads of fun at this station, this activity helps children develop hand-eye coordination and practice other fine motor skills.
- 6. Gold mining: Fill a small toddler-sized swimming pool with sand, gold nuggets (river rock sprayed gold) mixed in with the sand, and gold sifting pans made from pie pans with holes punched in the bottom. Then let your Li'l Cowpokes go at it, sifting for gold!
- 7. Horse racing with pool noodle ponies: Provide an area where your Li'l Cowpokes can mount their horses and gallop around to get the wiggles out. Pool noodle ponies spark the imagination!
 - a. Purchase pool noodles from the Dollar Tree or your favorite discount store.
 - b. Make cuts on each side of the end of a pool noodle about 3" long. This will create the mouth as well as where you will place the rope to hold the head down. It is your choice how long you want your horse's head and neck to be.
 - **C.** Place the rope through the mouth, pull it towards the long end of the noodle, and tie it off. Leave some rope to make reins or to make a loop to put around your child's body.
 - d. To attach the mane and the ears, make a slit about 1" deep into the noodle. You will insert the mane into the slit. It will hold the mane in tight.
 - e. To make your mane, just take a piece of fleece and cut a 4" section. The length of your horse's mane will vary depending on the length of your slit.
 - f. Once you have it inserted snugly in the slit, make 1" cuts in the fleece so the strips look more like hair.
 - **g.** Use fleece scraps, brown or black felt, or scrapbook paper for the ears. Make shorter 1" deep slits (one on each side of the face) and insert triangular pieces of whichever material you've selected into the slits. Hot glue helps the ears stay in place.
 - h. Don't forget the eyes! Hot glue large googly eyes in place.





8. Sensory drawing table: Purchase an extra-large cake pan from an arts and crafts store or second hand store. Pour five cups of extra fine sand or Sandtastik Colored Play Sand into a large Ziploc bag and dot it with food coloring (must be gel). Knead the sand until the food coloring is thoroughly mixed in, then pour it into the cake pan. Using their fingers, kids will draw and redraw as they concentrate on their own ideas or copy a picture from drawing cards. Place the drawing cards beside the cake pan. (You can download these cards at AdventistVBX.com.)

Cactusville

Lay out a plastic tablecloth under each sensory
station. This will save
you a lot of time with
clean up and preparation
for the next day.

Decorating the Wild Horse Corral

There are no official decorations needed for this station. Setup for each day consists of putting down four orange traffic cones to define the boundaries of the activity space and then making sure the specific materials and supplies for each day's game are set out in their proper places. The sensory stations should also be stocked with the necessary materials and arranged throughout the available space.







Day One Program Overview

Round Up

Materials and Supplies

- · 4 orange traffic cones
- · Carpet tape, painter's tape, or masking tape (sidewalk chalk if outdoors on cement)
- Cowbell
- · Specific materials or supplies needed for each sensory station

Ahead of Time

Arrange and prepare your sensory stations. Cover them with tablecloths or sheets until it's time for free exploration in each group.

Set up your activity area for the group game using four orange cones to define your activity space. Use carpet tape, masking tape, or painter's tape to mark two parallel lines ten to 15' apart somewhere within the boundaries formed by the four cones.

Instructions

Jump to Me

Have the Ranch Hand Wranglers divide the children into four equal groups and line them up in single files behind one of the tape lines. Stand on the opposite line and start the first group of four by saying, "Jump to me."

Once the first group has jumped to you, start the next four and so on until everyone has had the chance to jump across to the other line. Then have the kids line up again on that side and jump again like jackrabbits, bigger and farther than before. This time stand on the starting line before saying, "Jump to me." If your time (5 minutes) isn't up, continue having the children jump back and forth, going in one direction like grasshoppers and the other like jackrabbits.

What to Say

Welcome to the Wild Horse Corral! We are going to play a fun game today. Before we get started, can you show me how to jump like a bunny? [Pause and let the children jump around for a few seconds. Then hold up your hand like a stop sign and tell them to stop.]

Here in the desert near Cactusville Ranch, we have really big bunnies called jackrabbits. They have very big ears and powerful back legs that help them jump really far. Pretend you're a jackrabbit and show me how far you can jump. [Pause and allow the children to practice jumping far in any direction] Oh my! You really can jump far! I think you are the best jackrabbit jumpers I've seen!

Today our Bible story is about John the Baptist. Some people think that John ate locusts, which are like grasshoppers. I don't think I would like to eat grasshoppers, [Make a face] but I bet I can jump like one! Their jumps are a little smaller than a jackrabbit's since they're not as big or powerful, but they can still jump pretty far for their size.





Come over to my starting line. We're going to let four of you grasshoppers jump across to the other line at the same time. Can you do that without bumping into each other? [Pause and wait for the kids to answer]

I'm going to go stand on the other line. When you hear me say, "Jump to me," you can start jumping. You will jump all the way to me and stop once you cross the second line. The rest of you who are standing in line will just wait right there until I call your group to jump to me. Ready? First group, jump to me!

Wow! You were good grasshoppers! And when you were pretending to be jackrabbits, you jumped really far! Nice job! Did you know that just like you jumped a lot during our game, John the Baptist had to walk really far each day to tell more people about Jesus? His legs must have gotten tired from all that walking just like yours did from jumping, but John the Baptist was happy to do it because he wanted as many people to hear about Jesus as possible.

Thank you for being such good grasshoppers and jackrabbits! Now we are going to go over to our sensory station area and you can play at any station you want. Remember, when you hear the cowbell, it's time to line up to go to your next station. [Uncover the sensory stations]



Thank you for coming to the Wild Horse Corral today! Now it's time to mosey on over to your next station. I hope to see you again soon. Yee-haw!

Campfire Stories at Sunset Canyon

Kids follow **Abraham** as he leaves his comfortable home and all his friends. They see how he was faithful to God's calling as he journeyed to an unknown land.

Wild Horse Corral

Li'l Cowpokes play the game **Round 'Em Up** and then are free to wander from one sensory activity to another.

Trading Post

Kids use their imaginations while making the **Paper Plate Pony** craft. Playing with their Paper Plate Ponies will remind them of Jesus' call to be faithful.

Chuckwagon

Kids enjoy **Tacos in a Cup**. The variety of ingredients in this snack, represents all the belongings Abraham had to pack up when God called him to leave his home.

Materials and Supplies

- · 4 orange traffic cones
- · 25 pink balloons and 25 white balloons, inflated
- 4 medium-sized cardboard boxes (2' x 3')
- · 4 pieces pink construction paper and 4 pieces white construction paper
- Tape
- 10 fly swatters with plastic handles
- · Tambourine or small hand drum
- Cowbell
- Specific materials or supplies needed for each sensory station

Ahead of Time

Arrange and prepare your sensory stations. Cover them with tablecloths or sheets until it's time for free exploration in each group.

Set up your activity area for the group game using four orange cones to define your activity space. Prepare for the group game by inflating 25 pink balloons and 25 white balloons. Scatter the balloons across the floor of the entire space, making sure the colors are well mixed. Arrange two medium-sized boxes (2' x 3') on each end of your activity area at least 15'-20' apart. Tape pieces of pink construction paper to the boxes on one side, and pieces of white construction paper to the boxes on the other end. Lay the boxes on their sides so balloons can be pushed into them. Have ten fly swatters ready for the children to use.

Instructions

Round Up

Divide the children into two groups and give ten fly swatters to each group. Tell one group that it's their job to drive all the white cattle (or white balloons) into the white corrals, and the other that it's their job to drive all the pink cattle (or pink balloons) into the pink corrals. Give five children from each group a fly swatter to tap or push the balloons into the boxes. Give a demonstration of how to move a balloon into a box using the fly swatter. Tell the ten children with the fly swatter that they can corral as many cattle as possible, but when they hear two taps on a tambourine (or two hand claps), they need to return to their groups and share the fly swatters with five other children. Give each group of ten approximately one minute to corral cattle. If all the balloons end up in the boxes before all the children have had a turn, scatter the balloons around the activity space and begin again. Spend a full five minutes doing this activity so the children have as many turns as possible.





Keep the Ranch Hand Wranglers nearby to supervise the children using the fly swatters and make sure they don't raise them too high and hit another child. They can also assist any children who may be having difficulty guiding a balloon into the box and remind children which color balloon they are supposed to be corralling. When the signal is given to hand off the fly swatters to other children in their group, the Ranch Hand Wranglers can help that transition go smoothly.

When the time is up, some of Ranch Hand Wranglers can collect the fly swatters while others go uncover the sensory stations.

What to Say

Welcome back to the Wild Horse Corral, Li'l Cowpokes! I'm glad to see you again! Our Bible story today is about Abraham. God called Abraham to leave his comfortable home, pack up his belongings, and travel to a place he knew nothing about. Abraham obeyed God's call and took his family and all his cattle with him. They would travel during the day and then set up a tent to sleep in each night. In order to keep his cattle safe from wild animals during the night, Abraham would herd his cattle into corrals. It was hard work getting all that cattle into their corrals. Today we're going to pretend these cardboard boxes are the corrals for the cattle. As you can see, we have two pink corrals and two white corrals. All the pink balloons are the cattle that need to go into the pink corrals and all the white balloons are cattle that need to go in the white corrals.

Are you ready? Let's go corral that cattle!

Good job! That was fun! Now that our cattle is safe, you may go over to our sensory stations and play at any station you want. Remember, when you hear the cowbell, it's time to line up to go to the next station.



Thank you for coming to the Wild Horse Corral today! Now it's time to hit the dusty trail and move on to your next station. See you next time. Yee-haw!

- 2 large buckets
- 5-10 lbs. of red beans (amount depends on size of your group)
- · Stack of paper or 8-10 Styrofoam drinking cups
- Cowbell
- Specific materials or supplies needed for each sensory station

Ahead of Time

Arrange and prepare your sensory stations. Cover them with tablecloths or sheets until it's time for free exploration in each group.

Set up your activity area for the group game using four orange cones to define your activity space. Prepare for the group game by setting a large bucket full of red beans (10 lbs. for larger groups, 5 lbs. for smaller groups) on one end of the activity space. (If you want, mark a starting line on the floor with masking tape or painter's tape.) Place a stack of paper or Styrofoam drinking cups beside the bucket. Place a large empty bucket 8'-10' away.

Instructions

Storing the Grain

Have two of your Ranch Hand Wranglers fill the cups with beans. Reuse the empty cups the children bring back and only fill each cup half full. When the first two children return to the starting line, have them hand their empty cups to the Ranch Hand Wranglers and then go to the end of the line while two more children go. It is likely that the children will have time for several turns carrying the cups of beans to the other bucket.

If you see the children starting to rush and spill beans or becoming too competitive, remind them that this is not a race; rather, they are just working together to

get all the beans from one bucket to the other. Encourage your Li'l Cowpokes with affirming phrases such as "Nice job!" or "High five!" Continue transporting beans until the bucket at the start-

ing line is empty. Play for five minutes.







What to Say

Welcome back to the Wild Horse Corral, Li'l Cowpokes! I'm glad to see all of you again! Today's Bible story is about Joseph. Although Joseph had a lot of adventures in his life and had to go through some really tough times, God was with him the whole time. In fact, God had a special plan for Joseph. During the seven years of good weather in Egypt, the people were able to grow lots of grain for food. God told Joseph how to store the grain so that he would be able to give it to people during the years when there wasn't enough food to eat. Because Joseph listened to God and made big storage barns for all the extra grain, Joseph was able to help a lot of people. His own brothers came from far away to get grain when they didn't have any more food and Joseph helped them too, even though they had been mean to him many years before. God helped Joseph forgive his brothers.

We are going to pretend to be Joseph's helpers today and help store some grain. Let's imagine that this big bucket of beans is grain and that we need to store it all in that bucket way over there! [Point to the empty bucket]

We will let two Li'l Cowpokes go at the same time. Ranch Hand Wranglers will fill your cups with our pretend grain and then you can carry it over to our storage container (the empty bucket), and pour it in. Be very careful not to spill any of your grain on the way over! Once your cups are empty, please bring them back with you. Are you ready? The first two may go!

Wow! Look in our bucket! We emptied this big bucket of beans and filled our storage container over there! Way to go, Li'l Cowpokes! You are very hard workers! Joseph would have been happy to have you as his helpers! [Give them a thumbs up sign. While you continue to talk, have your Ranch Hand Wranglers uncover the sensory stations.]

That was fun, wasn't it? Even hard jobs like storing grain can be fun if we all work together. Good job, everyone! [Clap hands] Now that all our grain is safely stored, you may go over to the sensory stations and play. Remember, when you hear the cowbell, it's time to line up to go to your next activity.



The cowbell is telling us that it's time to leave the Wild Horse Corral. Thank you for coming, Li'l Cowpokes! We had lots of fun today. I look forward to seeing you again real soon! Happy trails to you!




- · 4 orange traffic cones
- 2 pairs of adult size cowboy boots or draw-and-color boots on both sides of four plain brown grocery sacks
- · Masking tape, carpet tape, or painter's tape
- Several bags of party store rubber snakes (50-60 snakes total)
- Cowbell
- · Specific materials or supplies needed for each sensory station

Ahead of Time

Arrange and prepare your sensory stations. Cover them with tablecloths or sheets until it's time for free exploration in each group.

Set up your activity area for the group game using four orange cones to define your activity space. Prepare for the group game by setting out one real cowboy boot or draw-and-color boot on each side of four plain brown grocery sacks. Place each boot about 5' feet apart on a line you've marked with tape so you can have four children participating simultaneously. Use tape to make two more lines. These lines are 10' away from and parallel to the line where the boots are sitting—one on each side. (See the diagram.) Place 12-15 rubber snakes near each boot.







Instructions

Snakes in Boots

Have the Ranch Hand Wranglers divide the children into four equal groups and line them up in four single files behind one of the tape lines, facing the boots. (See the diagram.) Assign one Ranch Hand Wrangler or Station Leader to be in charge of each line of children. At your signal to begin, have the first child in each line walk to the boot in front of them. Have a Ranch Hand Wrangler follow each one and hand them three rubber snakes, then supervise while the child drops the first snake into the boot, moves backward and tosses the second snake, and either stays in place to toss the third one or move backward again. If they forget what to do, the Wrangler can assist them. When that child finishes, the Ranch Hand Wrangler should direct them to walk forward to the line on the other side of the boot and wait there, then motion to the next child in line to come up and try next. Continue in this manner until all children have had a turn. Play for five minutes. If time permits, start again and let everyone have a second turn.

What to Say

Welcome back to the Wild Horse Corral, Li'l Cowpokes! I'm tickled pink to see you again!

I think you'll like the little game we're going to play today! Out here in the desert around Cactusville Ranch we have a lot of wild critters. Some of them are friendly, while others are a little dangerous. One of those more dangerous types of critters is the rattlesnake. Because they can slither around and hide almost anywhere, every morning before you put on your boots, you need to turn them upside down and give them a shake to make sure a snake didn't crawl into them during the night! [Pick up one of the boots, turn it upside down, and shake it]

Today, instead of shaking snakes out of our boots, we're going to try to toss snakes into the boots! This is how we'll do it. If I'm the first person in my line, I will walk up to the boot that's in front of me and pick up three rubber snakes. Then I'll stand right in front of my boot and try to drop one of my snakes into it.

[Demonstrate dropping a snake into the boot] Yee-haw! I made it! If the snake misses the boot, that's okay too. We'll just leave it on the ground.

Next, I'll take one giant step backwards and try to lightly toss my second snake into the boot. [Demonstrate taking one step backwards and then making a low underhand toss towards the boot. Miss on purpose.] Ooops, I missed! That's okay. Since I missed, I can choose to stay here in the same spot and try to toss my third snake into the boot, or I can take one more giant step backwards and toss my snake from there. [Demonstrate taking one more step backwards and making another underhand toss—it doesn't matter if you make or miss it] Each of you will get to toss three snakes, just like I did. Let's see how many snakes we can toss into the boots!

[When the game is finished, call the children over to where you're standing and have them cluster around you. While you're talking, the Ranch Hand Wranglers can uncover the sensory stations.]





Come over to me, Li'l Cowpokes. [Gesture with one arm for them to come] Our Bible story today is about a brave woman named Deborah. God asked her to do something really hard, and with His help she did it! Hurray! [Punch one fist upwards] Today in our game you tried to toss snakes into cowboy boots, which is pretty hard too, isn't it? Give yourself a hand for doing such a great job! [Clap hands until the kids do the same]

That was lots of fun, wasn't it? Now it's time to go over to the sensory stations and play. You may visit as many of them as you want. Remember, when you hear the cowbell it will be time to line up to go to your next activity.

Plan for about three hearts per child. Once you have all the hearts, cut each one in half with a zig zag line. Then all you have to do to prepare on Day 5 is scatter the heart halves all over your activity space. (Don't put the matching halves of the hearts too close to each other. Mix them up some.)





Broken Hearts

Hi Li'l Cowpokes! Welcome to our last day at the Wild Horse Corral! I have had a great time playing games with you this week and I think you'll like the game we are playing today. In order to play this game, I need you to help me do something. Are you ready to help? [Pause, nod your head yes, and wait for the kids to respond] Good! I knew I could count on you! So put on your listening ears and listen carefully. [Mime putting a listening ear on each side of your head and wait for them to do the same]

I need you to go all around our activity space inside the four orange cones, find all the broken hearts you can, and bring them back to me. When you pick them up, be careful not to bend or crinkle them. Are you ready? [Pause and wait for a response] Very good! You can start looking for broken hearts now. Pick them up carefully and bring them back to me all nice and flat. [Give the children 30-40 seconds to pick up the hearts and come back to where you are]

Wowee! Look at all these broken hearts! You did a nice job of finding them! Now I have another job for you. Let's try and put all these broken hearts back together again. We can do that right here on the floor. [It's okay if the children don't find a perfect match for each broken half, but each heart should have a right









side and a left side, not two rights or two lefts. No glue or tape is needed. They can just place the two halves side by side. Play this activity for 5 minutes total.]

Look at all the hearts we put back together again. Good job, Li'l Cowpokes! When we talk about having a broken heart, we usually mean that we feel very sad. Jesus loves us so much that when we feel sad, He feels sad right along with us. Did you know that? [Pause, nod your head yes, and wait for the kids to respond] When you are happy, He is happy too!

God called Jesus to come and give us love. One way Jesus shows that He loves us is by helping to put all our sad, broken hearts back together so we can feel happy again. When we are happy, that makes Jesus feel very happy too! In our little game today, we did just what Jesus does for us. We found a bunch of broken hearts and put them back together again! Let's say a big thank you to Jesus for loving us so much that he fixes our broken hearts. [Pause slightly and then slowly say, "Thank you," so all the children can say it with you. While you continue to talk, the Ranch Hand Wranglers can uncover the sensory stations.]

Now it's time to go over to our sensory stations for one final time and play. Visit as many of them as you want, but don't forget to listen for the cowbell. It tells you when it's time to line up and get ready to go to your next activity.



I hear that old cowbell ringing, so it's time for you Li'l Cowpokes to hit the dusty trail and mosey on to your next station. I've really enjoyed having all of you here at the Wild Horse Corral this week. Thanks for coming and I hope to see you again next year!











Tips for the Trading Post Craft Leader

- Prepare for a mess. Yes, it's okay! Your job is to set up a space where your preschoolers feel free
 to experiment with different mediums and get messy! Just throw a plastic tablecloth under your
 table and chairs.
- 2. Avoid giving detailed direction. Show your preschoolers the finished project and then give general directions, allowing them to use their own creativity and imagination while making the craft. If they ask for help, assist them, but affirm that they are doing a great job and that you have confidence that they can do this project without much (or any) help from a grown-up.
- 3. Speak specifically about art. When talking to your preschoolers about their finished projects, be intentional with your comments. For instance, you can ask, "I see you used a lot of purple. Why did you choose that color?"
- 4. **Explore your preschooler's imagination.** Often the best way to encourage conversation about your preschooler's project is to ask an open-ended question like, "Can you tell me about what you made?" or "Did you have fun making that?"
- 5. **Just let it be.** When a child finishes a piece, don't suggest additions or changes! Their art piece is beautiful just as they made it! It's important for a child to feel that what he or she's created is good enough—even if it's just a splat on the page.

Decorating Your Craft Center

Kids will have fun using their imaginations and making authentic Cactusville crafts at the Trading Post!

Create a store look for your Trading Post. Use brown paper to cover the tables. Use black or white crates to display art projects and supplies by turning them on their side.

Suggestions:

- Use burlap to cover the supply tables and put your craft supplies in baskets or old wooden boxes.
- Use canning jars, candles, folded fabric, large jars with bright colored balled yarn, and baskets filled with apples and fresh corn or in-season vegetables as decoration.
- Find an old standing hat rack and hang cowboy hats and bonnets on it.
- Stuff burlap bags with newspaper to give them the impression of being full. Wooden barrels or half-barrels filled with flowers also make great decorations
- Check Pinterest for other great Western decorating ideas.

Cactusville TIPS

This project is a bit messy, but so beautiful! Your kids, parents, and Cactusville Ranch helpers will all be oohing and aaahing over the finished project.

Before starting the project, make sure the Li'l Cowpokes are covered with a large plastic bag that has holes for their arms and a slit up the back. Tape it closed at the top once they are in.

Introduction

Welcome to the Trading Post! Today our Bible story is about John the Baptist and how Jesus called him to be different. [Helpers hand out the mirrors and help two to three children at a time taking turns looking in the mirror]

What do you see? Yes, you see you! Now move the mirror over and see if you and your friend are in it. Can you see your friend? What do you see? Are you both the same? Do you have the same color hair? What about the color of your eyes?

[While the kids are still looking in the mirror] God took extra time and thinking when He made you! He was careful to make you different than anybody else. That is pretty cool! You are very important to Him! And remember, we are called! [Cup a hand to one ear as a cue for them to respond]





Kids: Called to be different! Yee-haw!

[Gently take the mirrors and put them away] It is time to put our mirrors away and get out our craft supplies. Are you ready to make something really fun?

Instructions

Swirls of Color

- 1. Cut heavyweight construction paper 5" x 7" size.
- 2. Now the fun part begins. Spray a nice, thick layer of shaving cream into a rectangular baking dish or tray—one that is large enough to easily fit your paper inside.
- **3.** Put drops of food coloring into the shaving cream. Use several different colors. (We used gel food coloring, but liquid works too.)

4. With a plastic fork, start folding and swirling the shaving cream to gently move the color around.

Don't overmix it, as you'll want to keep that nice swirly pattern.

- Your pattern doesn't have to be perfect—don't worry about "marbling" the shaving cream too much. It will do all its marbling magic on its own.
- **6.** Place the paper, tape side up, onto the shaving cream.
- 7. Use your fingers to gently press down the paper so that as much of it makes contact with the shaving cream as possible. You don't want the paper to sit for too long, as it will start to get too wet. Gently lift the paper off the shaving cream from one corner. You can reuse the cream several times before it becomes muddy. Just squirt in more food coloring, mix, and repeat.
- 8. Place it onto a paper towel. Take your ruler and from one corner, scrape the shaving cream off in one sweeping motion.
- 9. Beautiful! Ooh la la! Take a fresh paper towel and wipe away any excess shaving cream. Set the paper aside to dry. This just takes a minute or two. While the paper is drying, the kids can clean their hands and table area.
- 10. Once the masterpiece of swirls is dry, bring out the felt circles, jumbo googly eyes, and precut red yarn.
- 11. Demonstrate how to create a smiley face.



Cactusville TIP

We took the swirly masterpieces over to another counter and gently blow-dried them while the kids were cleaning up their area. Be sure their names are on the back!

Ahead of Time

This is a great craft with many different textures to explore. Before the children are due to arrive, take the following steps.

- 1. The first step is to cut your vest from the paper bag. This is easy! Start by cutting arm holes on each side of the bag, about 3"-4" in. See the picture.
- 2. Cut a neck hole at the top, about 4"-5".
- 3. Open up your bag so that you have the flat side (the bottom of the bag) on top. From the opening you already made for the neck, just cut around the entire flat area, just leaving about 2"-3" on each side. This will be what lays on the child's shoulders.
- 4. Cut a straight line from bottom to top on your bag. This will be the opening of your vest.
- 5. Go ahead and turn your vest inside out. You want the store logo to be on the inside, so you have a plain canvas to decorate.
- 6. The last step is to cut off the extra piece of paper on each side of the arm holes. Just cut in a straight line to get rid of the excess. See the pictures for guidance.
- 7. Cut out a sheriff badge from the yellow foam (download the free template at AdventistVBX.com).

Introduction

Howdy, Li'l Cowpokes! It's always a pleasure to see you! Welcome to the Trading Post! [Give each Li'l Cowpoke a high five]

Today our Bible story is about a lady named Deborah. Jesus called Deborah to serve, and that is just what she did! She helped all kinds of people with all kinds of problems. Sometimes she even sang songs to help others feel better! Isn't that nice?





Maybe we can make up a song to sing right now! [Have the Ranch Hand Wranglers hand out a shaker to each child]

To go and serve everyone [Shake your shaker around in a circular motion]

You are good little helpers, just like Deborah, our Bible story character for today. She was a good helper too! [Bring out a tray with all your craft supplies. Follow the directions.]



At Your Service Sheriff Vest

- 1. Lay out a vest in front of each Li'l Cowpoke.
- 2. Show them how to draw dashed lines around the vest's edges so they look like sewing lines.
- 3. Have them draw buttons and color them in using markers or crayons.
- 4. Write "Sheriff" on the foam badge and color small circles at the points of the star.
- 5. Glue the badge to the left side of the vest.
- Encourage the Li'l Cowpokes to color and draw on their vest. Don't forget to write their names on the inside neck area.
- 7. Let the kids try on their vests. Make affirmative remarks about each one.
- 8. When Li'l Cowpokes leave at the end of the day, encourage them to wear their vests.

CHUCKWAGON SNACKS





What to Expect at the Chuckwagon

Chuckwagon Chatter

The activities at this station are a delightful blend of preparation by the leaders and implementation by the children. For example, the Leaders prepare individual servings of each day's snack ingredients and set up work stations (placemats) for the children. They tie in the snack with that day's Bible story character and lead the children in the Daily Call. Once seated at their work stations, the children get to assemble or decorate their snacks and eventually eat them. The snacks chosen for this week's VBX are kid—tested and quality-assured by the Chuckwagon team! The eating becomes even more fun because each day's recipe includes a hands-on component where the Li'l Cowpokes get to participate in the creation of a very tasty snack.

Allergy Alerts

Food allergies are very common in children these days, so pay close attention to the following pieces of information.

- Post a notice that snacks will be served at VBX. Post it in a place where
 parents and staff will see it as they arrive with their children. You could even draw or print a picture
 of the snack with a list of ingredients.
- Require that allergy or food restriction information be placed on registration forms. Make sure all your Chuckwagon staff has a copy of the registration cards that are marked "Allergy Alert."
- If a Li'l Cowpoke's allergies are severe, discuss with your VBX leader and Chuckwagon staff about using stickers or medical alert bracelets. This is very important, especially when serving snacks to younger children who may not be aware of their allergies or food restrictions.

Just the Basics

- 1. Feel free to modify the ingredients of your snack selection to meet the specific needs or restrictions of the Li'l Cowpokes who come to your Chuckwagon station.
- 2. After you've had a chance to read through your Chuckwagon recipes, compile a grocery list to submit to your VBX Preschool Leader. Save yourself valuable time during VBX program operation hours when the kids are at your station by organizing and preparing the ingredients that go with each snack in advance. For example, you can organize your Chuckwagon supply area with each day's

Each day at Cactusville Ranch, you will either make your snack or have it delivered to you from the Cactusville Chuckwagon snack leader. The supply list and recipes are all provided for you in this guide. After each recipe you will find script suggestions that go with each day's Daily Call and reinforcement of the Gold Nugget.





snack ingredients in a separate crate labeled with the day and snack recipe on the outside. You could also go one step further on the day of and organize a snack's individual ingredients into separate bowls, or assemble individual "snack packs" for each Li'l Cowpoke that contain all the ingredients.

- 3. The Chuckwagon station does more than provide a yummy snack for the Li'l Cowpokes. The leader's introductory remarks include a reference to that day's Bible story character and the Daily Call. The children get to practice that day's call and response sequence with the leader as well as participate in a special activity involving the placemat that serves as their work station for assembling and eating their snack. For example, on the first day the Li'l Cowpokes are given a Called to be Different placemat and are instructed to draw something happy on it as a message to the next Li'l Cowpoke that sits at that spot. They can also sign their names.
- 4. Always pray with your group before they eat their snack. In addition to asking a blessing on the food, you can thank God for calling each child to follow Him.

Staff and Job Description

If you make your own snacks at Cactusville Ranch, you will need Leader and an Assistant Leader for this station. If the snacks are delivered to you, one Leader may be sufficient. Each day you will need to:

- Download and print enough placemats for all the children. Always make a few extra copies, just in case.
- Assemble individual servings of that day's snack ingredients and place them in a Ziploc bag or a disposable bowl so the children can participate in the hands-on portion of making the snack.
- Clean up the children's food preparation area (tables and placemats) between groups so there is a clean work space waiting for each new group that passes through.
- Supervise the children as they assemble or decorate their snacks and assist anyone that needs help.
- Memorize or familiarize yourself with the short script that serves as an introduction to that day's snack. Speak slowly and clearly so everyone can hear and understand what you're saying.
- Set aside time to say a blessing for the snack prior to the children starting to chow down.
- Familiarize yourself with the placemat activity for each day and know which days the placemats
 stay at the station and which days the children take them home. This will help you determine how
 many placemats you need to have on hand for that particular day.
- Before each group leaves your station, make a few closing remarks. These are scripted for you. Try to memorize your lines so you can speak naturally without having to refer to a paper.



Make sure that the first and last thing the Li'l Cowpokes who come to your station do is wash their hands! They not only need clean hands to eat their snack, but also to prepare the food and help prevent cross-contamination between children.





Decorations & Set Up

The Chuckwagon snack area should be set up to look as much like the surroundings of an actual chuckwagon from the Old West as possible. Props like cast iron skillets, big black cast iron pots, stacks of logs for an imaginary fire, metal plates (all the better if they have dents in them), and old metal forks will help create the right atmosphere. Other fun and easy decorating ideas include:

- Stringing up a strand of red bandana pennants (http://m.orientaltrading.com/web/browse/ processProductsCatalog?sku=3/8748)
- Covering tables with red and white checkered or solidcolored (in darker shades) plastic/vinyl tablecloths
- Filling large glass jars (canning jars or larger) with colorful plastic beads, colorful plastic drinking straws, small skeins or balls of colorful yarn, and plastic fruit
- Using baskets, metal buckets, and small wooden crates to hold your food prep supplies and large packages of your snack ingredients
- Displaying a Chuckwagon sign (this can be as simple as painting the word "Chuckwagon" on a piece of wood with black paint)
- Look online at AdventistVBX.com for pictures and instructions of these and other ideas. Pinterest is also a great source of creative ideas!

God called John to tell other people that Jesus was coming soon! And John did just that! He loved telling people about Jesus. Our snack today is called Prairie Dog Ponchos. Just like the food inside our Prairie Dog Ponchos is wrapped up all nice and snug, we are wrapped up safe and tight in Jesus' loving arms. [Huq yourself and encourage the children to do the same]

Today we're going to make Prairie Dog Ponchos, and the first thing we need to do is make sure our hands are clean. [Give a squirt of hand sanitizer to each child]

Song or Poem: Wash, Wash, Wash Your Hands

(To the tune of Row, Row, Row Your Boat)

Wash, wash, wash your hands

Wash them nice and clean

Scrub them here [Motion scrubbing your hands together] **and And scrub them there** [Motion scrubbing the tops of your hands] **And scrub them in between** [Motion scrubbing between your fingers] Cactusville

If serving the Waffle Blanket recipe, just adjust your script: "Our snack today is called a Waffle Blanket. A blanket keeps us snuggly and warm at night. Did you know that Jesus will wrap His arms of love around us to make us feel snuggly and safe?"





Prairie Dog Poncho





- Cut hot dogs in half. Cover baking sheets with foil. Unroll crescent rolls from package and cut each roll into three triangles. Place hot dogs, rolls, and cheese in separate bowls. Preheat the oven to 375° degrees.
- 2. Put ½ hot dog on each triangle or cut tortilla. Add shredded cheddar cheese. Roll up the "poncho," starting at one end and working to the other. Bake as directed on the package. If you're using a tortilla, no baking is needed. Serve with ketchup and mustard.

Kids Can Do It!

Provide children with prepared crescent rolls, cut hot dogs, and cheese in separate bowls (each child has three bowls of their own for each ingredient) and let them create their own Prairie Dog Poncho. Demonstrate how to roll up the crescent roll dough. It's okay if it's not perfect! It still tastes yummy!









Waffle Blankets



Preparation

- 1. Prepare waffles ahead of time, heating them according to the box instructions.
- 2. Cut each waffle into quarters and serve to the kids on small paper plates along with plastic forks and knives.
- **3.** Put a plate holding a quarter waffle along with a plastic knife and fork at each placemat.
- 4. Provide all toppings in separate bowls at each table along with plastic spoons for kids to use in decorating their own Waffle Blanket.
- 5. Kids can top their Waffle Blankets with fruit jelly, fruit slices, syrup, or whipped cream, serving themselves from the individual bowls of toppings provided at each table.
- **6.** Instruct Lil' Cowpokes to use only enough toppings to "dress up" their blanket.

You can see some examples of pictures you can draw already printed on your placemat. Oh, and don't forget to sign your name! When you're finished, you can leave them right there on the tables. It will be a surprise for the next person who sits in your seat!

[When it's almost time for the children to go] Make sure your hands are clean before you mosey on off to your next station. [Give a squirt of hand sanitizer to each child]

Cactusville TIP

When the next group comes to the Chuckwagon, the placemats will already be in place and drawn on. Comment affirmatively on the messages left for the new group. For example, you could say, "Oh look! Here is a message from our friends who were here before us! Isn't that nice! Look at that happy sunshine," or "Oh, look at that flower and all the beautiful colors," etc.

By the time the second or third group arrives, the placemats are going to start looking a little messy—that's okay! Just gently wipe off any excess food while being careful not to smudge the messages. The added grease spots will give the messages a more authentic and intriguing look. Yee-haw!

Preparation

1. Cut up and prepare all the topping selections ahead of time. Preparation

- 1. Prepare the dough right before each group comes in.
- 2. Place almonds in the bowl of a food processor. Pulse until finely chopped.
- 3. Add oats, flax seed, and cocoa/carob powder. Pulse a few more times to combine.
- 4. Place dates in the food processor and turn on for about 30 seconds, or until finely chopped. Mixture should be crumbly at this point.
- Drizzle 1 tablespoon coconut oil over the top of the entire mixture and process for 5 to 10 seconds.
- **6.** Test mixture by squeezing between your finger and thumb. If it's too dry to stick together, add more coconut oil (up to 1 tablespoon more).
- 7. Place 1/2 1/3 cups of the mixture along with M&M's or chocolate chips/carob chips in a sandwich sized Ziploc bag and seal it.
- 8. Prepare one bag for each child.
- Hand a Ziploc to each child with instructions to knead the dough and then flatten it into a chapati shape (round and flat) while it's still in the bag.
- 10. Tell them to keep the dough in the bag until it's time to eat.

 - b. they can use a toothpick and pick up one chunk of fruit at a time and dunk it in their dip, swirling it around until it is completely covered. Using this method, they would eat one piece of fruit at a time before dunking the next piece.
- 7. Have wet paper towels nearby so the children can clean their sticky fingers.

If serving Wagon Wheel pasta, just adjust your script and say, "Our snack today is Wagon Wheel pasta. It represents the life Jesus lived while He was here on this earth. His life was one of always helping other people, just like a wagon wheel rolling on and on."





~ Wagon Wheel Cookies ~



Preparation

Bake or buy large sugar cookies ahead of time. Before
the children arrive, prepare their work stations by placing
a large paper plate with a cookie, plastic knife, and one
Twizzler on each placemat. Place a small cup of frosting
and an individual packet of hot cocoa mix between every
two placemats, so that two children can access them.

Kids Can Do It!

Once seated, the Li'l Cowpokes may start decorating their cookies to make them look like wagon wheels. While they are busy dec-

orating their cookies, say, "Think about what you can give back to Jesus as a thank you for coming to live here on earth. An example might include being kind to others." [Encourage the kids to come up with other ideas and to share them as they work]

The Li'l Cowpokes' placemats will be their decorating work stations, each comprised of a large paper plate containing a sugar cookie and a plastic knife. Place one Twizzler Pull & Peel by each plate along with a packet of hot cocoa mix and a small cup of frosting (both of which can be shared between two children). The kids will

- 1. Use a plastic knife to spread a thin layer of frosting on the top side of the cookie,
- 2. Tear open the hot cocoa packet and sprinkle a little cocoa mix on the frosting,
- Take the Twizzler and pull it apart into individual strands of licorice.
- 4. Use one or more strands to form the rim of the wagon wheel (placing the strands in a large circle near the edge of the cookie).
- 5. Place a very short licorice strand in a tight circle at the center of the cookie to form the wheel's hub.
- 6. Use the rest of the Twizzler strands as spokes for the wheel (these strands will need to be broken to make them the right length for the spokes). Keep wet paper towels nearby so the kids can clean their sticky fingers once they're done.





~ Wagon Wheel Pasta ~



Preparation

- 1. Bring a large pot of water to a boil; add salt.
- 2. Add pasta; cook until al dente.
- 3. Drain well.
- 4. Transfer to a large bowl.
- **5.** Toss with butter.
- **6.** Add salt, mustard, and cheese; stir until cheese is melted.
- Scoop pasta into cups and place one cup along with a plastic fork on each placemat.
- 8. Warm the marinara sauce until heated through and place in small plastic bowls on all the tables along with small bowls of Parmesan cheese (grated or fresh) one bowl each for 3 to 4 children.
- **9.** Place plastic serving spoons nearby.

Kids Can Do It!

Once seated, the Buckaroos may help themselves to marinara sauce and sprinkle Parmesan cheese on top of their pasta.
